

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Dear Friends,

I notice, as I write this in early February, that there are already signs of spring beginning to appear. Those first bulbs always surprise me and always make me smile – perhaps because they inevitably put in an appearance at a time when the weather is quite often cold and bleak and new growth would seem to be impossible – and fool-hardy. Yet nature is so amazing and resilient. And the new growth offers us a sense of hope.

As you read this it will be March and spring should be well under way. I hope you are being bombarded by all the wonders and joys that this brings.

Also underway will be Lent – traditionally the Christian season of penitence and self-discipline. In the weeks leading up to Easter we are encouraged to review and reflect. At first glance this does not seem to offer anything to smile about but Lent can also offer us a time for potential new growth, new hope, new joy.

I am currently in the process of helping a family member to declutter prior to their moving house. You have possibly experienced the same phenomenon – sorting and sifting through cupboards and containers and every other possible hidey hole. And the resulting challenge of making decisions about whether to keep or throw out. Is the item still used or useful? Will it really ever be used again?

As we have worked there's been a lot of reminiscing and remembering. It's being a good, though emotional, experience. But we've also understood that underlying the tidying up and the throwing away has been the question about why we accumulate so much "stuff" and why we hang on to things when they are no longer useful? There's been a growing awareness that perhaps we are called to simplify our lives.

I think this is what God does in us as we turn to him during Lent. He encourages us to simplify – to get rid of those things – habits, prejudices

etc - that we have clung to but which we no longer need and are no longer useful. God wants us to be less busy, less frantic and less stressed and to live with more freedom, more hope and more joy.

So I pray that you might find that this month is a time for de-cluttering and that God might surprise you.


