

TIP OF THE MONTH - Prune winter-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering and Summer-flowering shrubs that flower on new wood also hardy evergreen trees and shrubs and jasmines and late flowering clematis. Apply organic-based fertilizers and mulch after feeding. Start Dahlia tubers into growth in shallow trays and re-pot or top-dress shrubs in containers.

February Music notes

Grafty Gourmet

This month's recipe is a great tasting and warming soup. Ideal for vegetarians and great for these cold winter days.

Sweet Potato & Butternut Squash Soup with Garlic & Lemon Toast

For the soup

500g sweet potatoes, peeled and diced

1 butternut squash, peeled, deseeded and diced

1 tbsp clear honey

1 tbsp olive oil

2 onions, roughly chopped

3 garlic cloves, crushed

1 litre vegetable or chicken stock

1 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp grated nutmeg 100ml double cream

For the toast

1 tbsp olive oil

3 garlic cloves, crushed

100g butter, at room temperature

zest 1 lemon

2 tbsp chopped chives

1 tbsp chopped thyme

2 ciabatta loaves, cut into slices

- 1. Heat oven to 200C fan. Put the sweet potato and butternut squash on a baking tray and add the honey and a drizzle of olive oil. Roast for 40-45 mins until soft and starting to caramelise at the edges, stirring occasionally.
- 2. Meanwhile, fry the onions in 1 tbsp olive oil until soft, then add the garlic, chicken stock, cinnamon and nutmeg. Bring to the boil, and simmer for 5 mins.
- 3. Remove the sweet potatoes and butternut squash from the oven and add to the pan with the stock. Blend everything until smooth using a stick blender. Stir in most of the cream and bring back to a gentle simmer, and season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 4. To make the lemon & garlic toasts, gently warm some olive oil and garlic in a pan over a low heat for a few mins; the garlic should be softened but not browned. Remove from the heat and mix in the butter and lemon zest until smooth. Leave to cool, then stir in the chives and thyme.
- 5. Toast the ciabatta slices, and top each with a spoonful of garlic butter. Serve with the soup, drizzled with the remaining cream, and some black pepper


