....the other two for space to show off our acting and dancing skills. Behind one of the sheets, we could change into makeshift costumes, the other being a side screen or useful backcloth for silhouette puppets.

I remember the excitement of wondering how many friends would come and watch and who would come. The conerts didn't last long, barely half an hour, but we provided a varied theme of acting, stand up comedy, singing, recitals and of course a little puppet show using our arms and hands to make dark shapes like swans and rabbit faces. We usually provided drinks and biscuits so we didn't make any money, just had lots of fun doing it. These concerts were held on Saturday afternoons when the yard was bound to be free of washing. There was other fun—I remember filling an old tin bath (we had the luxury of a bathroom with second toilet) with cold water and filling it with creatures collected from Tommy Brook, the name given for a local stream. I loved pets and my water creatures consisted of newts, lizards, frogs, tadpoles, minnows, water beetles—anything I could bring back in a jamjar. These I lovingly emptied into the tin bath full of cold water and watched them swim about. In my innocence, I didn't provide the correct food and they all escaped or died off. Of course, our pet cat which lived to a ripe old age, looked on with much amusement

I also remember a small patch of black soil, separated from the paved area. I tried my gardening skills growing radishes and lettuces and my sister tried growing nasturtiums. She had more success than me.; I remember lifting thin pink radishes but was pleased they tasted like those we bought at the outside market stalls in Accrington. The lettuce was small and feeble but fit to give our pet tortoises which we kept on and off during our childhood years.

The yard was used for all manner of things but as Autumn drew nearer, we started collecting firewood for the huge bonfire held on the spare land opposite. I can't remember where we found the firewood but when we went roaming round spare ground around the terraced streets, we always found large planks of wood, old fencing, fallen branches and twigs from local trees. This wood we collected after school, when the evenings grew darker and at weekends. As Bonfire Night came

"OUR BACK YARD"

Ours was no ordinary backyard. Ours was different, a hive of activity. I lived with my two sisters, older brother and parents in a large corner terraced house in industrial Accrington and I remember much fun and laughter coming from our backyard in the 1950s and 60s.

It was about twelve feet wide and fifteen feet long. To get to the backyard, you simply opened the kitchen door, walked through a leanto outhouse, through that door and then down two steps which, in themselves, proved useful for jumping on and off. At the far emd pf the backyard were three doors; the smaller one opened on to a dustbin and ashpit recess, the second door housed heaps of coal and the third was an outside toilet. Inside was hung scraps of newspaper on string torn into sizeable pieces. There was no toilet paper—this was the normal way of cleansing yourself in those days! A large wooden door kept locked led to the street outside.

Four washing lines hung across the yard. Invariably on a Monday these were full of sheets, shirts, school blouses, underwear, towels. With six of us at home, there was a never ending amount of washing. As we lived close to the railway line with regular steam trains passing by and people hand belching chimneys emitting black smoke from lit

fires, the washing was prone to smuts and smears. If the days proved dry and the washing taken in for ironing, the backyard provided endless play for us four children.

As I said, ours was no ordinary backyard. We held concerts—inviting local friends to come and watch. My brother charged a penny and some were lucky enough to sit on chairs which we provided; otherwise they sat on the steps leading from the kitchen. We had our own "scenery." We hit upon the idea of hanging sheets and blankets over two washing lines, removing




