Grafty Gourmet

This is yet another very simple recipe, and one suitable for vegetarians too. It's a great warming soup for the colder nights that are looming upon us. Serve with some crusty bread.

Butternut Squash Soup with Chilli & Crème Fraîche

- 1 butternut squash, about 1kg, peeled and deseeded
 2 tablespoons of olive oil
 1 tablespoon of butter
 2 onions, diced
 1 garlic clove, thinly sliced
 2 mild red chillies, deseeded and finely chopped
 850ml of hot vegetable stock
 4 tablespoons of crème fraîche, plus more to serve
- 1. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan. Cut the squash into large cubes, about 4cm ($1\frac{1}{2}$ inches) across, then toss in a large roasting tin with half the olive oil. Roast for 30 mins, turning once during cooking, until golden and soft.
- 2. While the squash cooks, melt the butter with the remaining oil in a large saucepan, then add the onions, garlic and ¾ of the chilli. Cover and cook on a very low heat for 15-20 mins until the onions are completely soft.

3. Tip the squash into the pan, add the stock and the crème fraîche, then whizz with a stick blender until smooth. For a really silky soup, put the soup into a liquidiser and blitz it in batches. Return to the pan, gently reheat, then season to taste. Serve the soup in bowls with swirls of crème fraîche and a scattering of the remaining chopped chilli.

Our **annual fete** is now only days away (Saturday 8th September). More details appear on a separate page of this issue but the theme is "Grafty Remembers -1918" so if you fancy dressing up in Edwardian style, bringing a 'Votes for Women' placard or perhaps sporting your Grandfather's (or Great Grandfather's) WWI medals, you'd be adding to the commemorative feel of the day.

Also, if you would care to make a cake or some biscuits to be sold on the tea stall, we would be very grateful for your contribution. Please contact Liz Burgess on 850377 if you can offer anything on these lines. And contributions to the 'alcoholic tombola' will be gladly received up to the day before the fete. Please leave any offerings at the village shop (where you can also buy the alcohol to donate!)

The next event in the Hall will be the annual **Harvest Supper**, organised by St.Nicholas Church in conjunction with the Village Hall Committee, and this is to be held on Saturday 13th October, so do make a note in your diary. You're very welcome to come along to this informal event, involving food, drink and nattering with friends, whether or not you are a regular church-goer.

Now, I mentioned a few months ago that we had decided to upgrade the **Hall kitchen**, and ideas have been slowly crystallising since then. We have to re-lay the floor (which has a damp problem) and will fit modern units to replace those that have served us well for years but have now come to the end of their useful life.

The proposed new design would involve closing up the present doorway between the entrance Hall and the kitchen and opening a new one where the serving hatch presently is. It may also involve boxing-in the under stairs area to make a new cupboard and re-locating the tables. The small tables might be stored in the ladies' toilet (where the cupboard presently stands in the corner near the door) and the large tables might be stored outside the gents' toilet (where the piano presently stands). The cupboard and piano would have to be sacrificed.

A bold alternative plan is to build a small extension (about $3.5m \times 2m$) to the rear of the gents' toilets, to move the gents' toilets into that extension and to store the tables where the gents' toilets presently are.

If you have any views on these ideas (which would require closure of the kitchen - and potentially the gents' loos - for a period) do get in touch with me. That's it for this month!

On Thursday September 13th there will be a By-Election for the seat of Headcorn Ward which includes Grafty Green.


This is a result of the resignation of the incumbent Shellina Prendergast in July.


