The fencing shall be place until all equipment, machinery and surplus materials have been removed from the site. Nothing shall be stored, disposed of, or placed, nor fires lit, in any area fenced.and the ground levels within these areas shall not be driven across by vehicles, altered, nor any excavation made (including addition/removal of topsoil/subsoil) without the consent of the LPA.</li> <li>External materials must match the existing building.</li> <li>The first floor en-suite bathroom window of the development hereby approved shall be obscure glazed and shall be installed before the extension is first brought into use and shall not be removed without the of the LPA.</li> <li>The development hereby permitted shall be begun before the expiration of 3 years from the date of this permission.</li> <li>The development shall be carried out strictly in accordance submitted plans.</li> </ol>
