Christmas in Finland

Christmas is definitely the most important and the most anticipated festival in Finland. It begins properly on the morning of the 24th of December when the tree is brought into the house and a star put on the top. Candles and other decorations including a garland of miniature Finnish flags are hung on the branches. At 12 noon the whole country quietens down when the Christmas Peace is declared from the old capital city of Turku. Crowds of people come to witness the 700 year old ceremony on the town square, a brass band plays and people sing Martin Luther's hymn 'A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing', the town's chief clerk reads the old proclamation and the ceremony concludes with the singing of the National Anthem. At home people have been listening to it on the radio and now wish each other Happy Christmas and toast with a warm glass of glögi (a mulled wine) served with raisins and almonds and accompanied with a star shaped tart.

A family service at the church starts at 3pm. On their way there, people place candles on the family graves. The whole cemetery is beautifully lit with hundreds of candles glowing in the snow and lighting the dark winter evening.

Back at home, the Christmas sauna has been heated and everybody looks forward to enjoying two or three bouts of good 'löyly' (sauna heat) and maybe cooling down in between by running outside to roll in the snow and trying to make the best snow angels.



Afterwards one feels relaxed, invigorated and cleansed, body and soul, and ready to sit down for the main meal of Christmas. It will contain many varieties of pickled or cured fish prepared using old family recipes, beetroot salad, patés, cold meats, a huge ham served with various vegetable bakes and home made mustard. For dessert there is creamy rice pudding served with cinnamon flavoured prune sauce. The rice pudding contains a single, hidden, blanched almond. Whoever finds the almond on their plate will have especially good fortune the following year and if single, might even meet their future intended!

But finding the almond is not the only excitement of the evening; the arrival of Father Christmas is eagerly awaited by the younger members of the family. He always comes in person providing the children have been good enough all through the year. Finally loud knocking

is heard at the door and 'Joulupukki' (Santa Claus) enters with his sack of presents and his 'tonttu' (Christmas elf) attendant. He always asks the children if they have been 'kiltti' (well behaved) and sits down to hear them sing Christmas carols. He gives out some of the presents himself and then leaves with exhortations for good behaviour in the coming year. Presents are then given and exchanged. Gift tags are read aloud as they contain rhymes giving clues about the contents of the parcel.

After a lot of laughter and excitement it is time to go to bed, although in the olden days people were expected to stay awake all Christmas night and to go to a 5am church service on Christmas Day! These days this service is held at 7am, but otherwise Christmas day is a family day, with visits to friends and parties only really starting on Boxing Day.

TV presenters become new Wildlife Trust Presidents

The 27-year-old Springwatch presenter Megan McCubbin was confirmed as the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust's President at the charity's recent annual general meeting on 5th November. McCubbin, who grew up in Hampshire, takes over from predecessor John Collman, who is retiring from the role after six years of service. Also appointed was naturalist and Springwatch co-presenter, Chris Packham, who became Vice President.



Rising television star McCubbin said: "I am over the moon to be the next President for the Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust. I have so much admiration for the fundamental work that the charity carries out - from the reintroduction of key species to their community conservation projects. At this critical time, we need all hands on deck to help protect wildlife and their habitats. I cannot wait to get stuck into my new role helping to protect the environment

across the two counties."

As well as presenting on the BBC's Springwatch and Autumnwatch programmes, McCubbin has recently co-authored her first book - Back to Nature: How to Love Life - and Save It – and is also a keen nature photographer. McCubbin's popularity and enthusiasm for wildlife will help the Trust reach new audiences and inspire more people from a wider range of ages and backgrounds

to get on nature's side.

The Trust is currently working towards its goals of inspiring at least one in four people to take action for nature, and to push for at least 30% of land and sea to be protected and restored for nature by 2030.

Debbie Tann, chief executive of Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, said: "We are thrilled to welcome Megan on board as our new President. We're currently facing immense pressures from the climate and nature crises, and Megan's significant conservation and

science communications experience will be crucial in helping us tip the balance in favour of nature's recovery."

New Forest-based Packham, who is McCubbin's stepfather, added: "I am delighted to join the superb Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust as a Vice President. In our current climate and ecological emergency, organisations such as the Wildlife Trusts are essential, and I am delighted to be part of it."

Time for a ghost hunt

The clocks have gone back, the nights are drawing in and the weather is on the turn. However, this doesn't mean the chances of seeing wildlife are gone. In fact, this time of year is fantastic for owl spotting.

As we head towards winter, barn owls, for example, will extend their hunting hours into daylight to find the extra food they need to get them through the colder months. These beautiful birds of prey, with their heart-shaped faces and ghost-white feathers, are perhaps one of the UK's most recognisable and cherished birds.

Barn owls can be spotted gliding through farmland, grassland, marshes, fens and cattlegrazed coastal fields, and they will even hunt alongside busy main roads. Masters of stealth, these predatory birds have evolved many impressive adaptations that make them expert hunters of small mammals. An old country name for this much-loved countryside bird is 'hushwing', which perfectly describes its silent, stealthy flight that helps it ambush unsuspecting prey. This smooth, ghostly, near-silent flight is achieved thanks to the trailing edge of its wing feathers being covered in soft, comb-like serrations that trap air and absorb noise.

Barn owls have incredible eyesight, too, which is specialised for hunting at night in total darkness – it's estimated their eyes are twice as sensitive to light as human eyes. They also possess camouflaged plumage, plus long legs and toes and sharp talons for snaring prey lurking in deep grass.

Their heart-shaped facial discs, meanwhile, help funnel sound into a pair of highly sensitive inner ears that allow the birds to detect tiny movements at ground level. In fact, barn owls are thought to have the most sensitive hearing of any animal in the world.

Interestingly, unlike other owls that hoot, barn owls make eerie screeching and hissing noises.



Generally, the best time to see them is at dawn and dusk on still, dry days. With such soft feathers, barn owl plumage isn't particularly waterproof and so they birds tend to avoid hunting during rainfall.

In our region, Hockley Meadows Nature Reserve in Winchester and Farlington Marshes Nature Reserve near Portsmouth are known to attract barn owls - the latter also hosts winter migrant short-eared owls.

Always remember to watch and photograph birds responsibly by keeping a good distance from wildlife, leaving no trace, and keeping dogs on leads at all times when visiting nature reserves.
