FINANCE PRECEPT UPDATE For next year's Budget we agreed that the Precept needed to increase by 2% from £68,471.20 to At January's meeting, the Parish Council agreed its £69,840.62; this puts the Band D equivalent up by Precept (Budget) for the coming financial year. For 2021/2022 our Tax Base increases from 732.08 to 736.27, meaning there are more "taxable" properties in the parish. This could be due to new builds or a reduction in the amount of properties that are either exempt from Council Tax or who are entitled to a discount.

carers, NHS staff and all key workers living in Stoke who are doing such valued and appreciated work; and to everyone who is quietly and compassionately looking out for their neighbours. Awesome.

Beware of scams!

We have been alerted by the police and the NHS to a number of scams going round in these uncertain times, so please take care! One example is where someone calls you or emails you asking for confirmation of your personal data such as bank account details, passport data etc. If they claim to be from your regular organisations like your broadband, TV Licensing or your bank please don't just give them the information over the phone - make sure you contact the company direct and check with them to see if the request is genuine. Another example is where a non-existent job is posted on a genuine recruitment site: and then the fake company advertising the job asks you for payment for a 'registration' or 'DBS check' etc. Check them out first to see if they actually exist. Never give in to pressure from doorstep salesmen to sign and agree to something there and then. All these scammers will take your personal details and sell them on to the 'dark web' to be used to commit fraud for their own benefit.

And finally, if someone comes knocking at your door and offering to vaccinate you there and then for cash - please just say **NO!** The NHS will:

- **NEVER** ask for payment the vaccine is free
- **NEVER** ask for your bank details
- **NEVER** arrive unannounced at your home to administer the vaccine
- **NEVER** ask you for copies of your personal documents such as your passport

We will all be contacted by the NHS when it is our own time to have an appointment, so please don't contact Hamdon Medical Centre direct. - Once connected you will be prompted to type in the meeting ID plus #, then #, then the password plus #. You will be placed in a 'Waiting Room' until invited to join.

All microphones will be automatically muted from the start of the meeting. If you wish to participate in the public session your microphone will be unmuted when you are invited to speak.
