PARISH COUNCIL

Extract from the minutes of the meeting held on 12th July 2004.

Matters arising

A) No reply as yet to the letter to Highways regarding road markings and the layout of the A34 junction. Clerk to write again suggesting that the 30 mile limit sign be moved further out, also to suggest traffic calming measures.

B) Speed Indicator Device (SID) Another training session to be held in the autumn when it is hoped West Ilsley will be included. Clerk to attempt to establish when SID will next be in West Ilsley.

C) Recreation Ground Fence. After a revue of future financial commitments, it was unanimously agreed that as the Parish Council are trustees to the Recreation Ground, the appeal for a donation of £200 towards repair of the fence should be met.

D) Dog Bins a verbal quote for £250 per bin plus a charge for cleaning and emptying had been received. Clerk to ask for a written confirmation.

E) A handsome new notice board is now in place outside the church. Thanks to Alec Cole for his work.

F) Cllr. Sean Ryan having signed the appropriate mandate will now be added as a signatory to the Parish Council bank account.

callers in the hope that we can obtain some leads to enable the criminals to be caught.

West Berkshire Police have also asked me to inform you about the most common tools and point of entries burglars use. Criminals gain entry mainly through unlocked front- and backdoors. They use ladders and tools that are kept in the garden as well as tools stored in sheds. They open front doors through letterboxes with an instrument and sometimes are able to obtain the house- and car keys also through the letterbox. Please don't leave any keys near the front or back door. Also try to keep your handbag and/or briefcase well out of reach. Most crimes happen through an arisen opportunity - especially in the summer when doors and windows are left unattended! We are currently seeing an increase in thefts from vehicles and vehicle interference in the Hungerford and Thatcham areas. Please ensure that no laptops or expensive items are left in vehicles. Please be extra vigilant and watch your security. If you see anybody acting suspiciously or have any information, please contact the Police on 0845 8 505 505 or Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. We are planning to involve individuals and their Carers in planning and evaluating such services to meet their needs. We hope that, by raising the profile of carers in West Berkshire, we will be able to contact those who care at home in order to offer them information, support and the opportunity for a break if this is what they want or need.

SPONSORED BEATING OF THE BOUNDS

of the Parishes of Brightwalton with Catmore August Bank Holiday, Monday 30th August 2004

All Saints Church, Brightwalton, was built in 1863 to the designs of George Street, one of the very best Victorian church architects, and it is listed Grade 2.

However, it now needs to have its roof replaced at a cost of about £70,000. Together with other repairs and refurbishments, the total cost will be nearer £100,000. This is a huge sum for a small parish to raise, but we are already well over half-way there.

One of the projects to raise this money is a Sponsored Beating of the Bounds of the Parishes of Brightwalton with Catmore on August Bank Holiday. This will be a walk of about 15 miles at your own pace over some of the most beautiful downland country in Berkshire. It will start and finish at Brightwalton Village Hall, starting at 10am, and those who go the whole way may expect to finish between 3pm and 5pm.

The boundaries of these two parishes border the parishes of Chaddleworth, Leckhampstead, Peasemore, Beedon, East Ilsley, West Ilsley, Farnborough and Fawley. In some places the boundaries run along public roads, in others along public rights of way, while in some places they run across private land. In those places where they are not on any public right of way, the permission of the relevant landowner has been obtained for us to walk that way.

Because part of the route is not on public rights of way, it will take many people to places where they have never been before. It will be a great way to see the countryside with your family and friends. Dogs will be welcome, but they must be kept on leads.

At key points where the route crosses or joins public roads, refreshments may be obtained, and transport back to Brightwalton will be available for those who do not wish to continue. Tea will be available at the Village Hall on return.

To take part, each individual or family must produce sponsorship or a donation of at least £10. A prize of £20 will be awarded to the person who has produced and paid the greatest amount of sponsorship.
