- 23/01-1. Welcome and Chairman's opening address- All welcomed to the meeting
- **23/01-2.** To receive apologies for absence-, Jeremy Russell, John Wynford and Nick Amor- the meeting was still quorate with 3 Cllrs in attendance.

23/01-7. Report from our Ward Councillor Tony Alford

Dorset Council is to receive around £4.5m over the next two years to continue several key programmes, as well as launch some new initiatives.

UK Shared Prosperity Fund (UKSPF), which matches and succeeds EU funding.

A new Investment Plan for Dorset, led by Dorset Council with input from a wide range of contributors, has been approved by the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, and will see the county benefit from £4.5m of UKSPF money.

Dorset's Investment Plan includes funding for: -

provision of energy efficiency advice through Low Carbon Dorset, the expansion of Healthy Homes Dorset energy efficiency scheme, development of affordable sustainable transport, especially for younger people, a new business support programme to support business growth and deliver business advice, basic and more advanced skills courses to help people enter the jobs market and secure better paid employment.

Dorset Council has published its proposals to deliver a balanced budget next financial year, 2023-24. The council's total net budget for 2023-24 will be £348 million.

The council proposes to increase council tax next year by just under 2% and to levy the adult social care precept of 2%. This is less than the maximum 5% increase outlined in the Government's Spending Review in December 2022. The increase would be equivalent to £1.41 extra per week for a Band D property.

Since becoming a unitary council in 2019, we have made efficiency savings of £76 million, and this money has been reinvested to protect frontline services.

Five libraries (including Bridport) are offering the chance to borrow an iPad for up to six weeks free of charge. The pilot scheme is being offered by Dorset Council libraries, who are working with Citizen's Advice and the Department for Work and Pensions to help people search and apply for jobs online. They can also be used to access online training to gain skills and knowledge.

Dorset Council is inundated with flooding issues across Dorset. Information at Dorset Council - Live travel updates, with the current weather changes the issue of salting and gritting of roads is now the issue. Car park charges are being rationalised, so they are uniform across the Dorset Council area.

23/01-8. To consider the Councillor Vacancies

Due to a technicality of meeting attendance Nicolas Amor ceases to be a Cllr for West Compton but can reapply when the vacancy notice period has been met so could be co-opted at the meeting in March. There is currently a vacancy for West Compton, Wynford Eagle and Toller Fratrum. Cllrs to encourage the filling of these vacancies, to note from 2024 following the Community Governance Review there will only be 1 Cllr for Toller Fratrum.

- i. P/HOU/2022/07247 Proposal: Replace existing section of glazed vaulted roof with slate roof-1 Lower Dairy, Midsummer Barn, Compton Valence- *no objections*.
- *ii.* P/HOU/2022/07323 Proposal: Retain constructed timber decking over existing garden area and alterations to existing pond to form natural swim area- Lower Dairy House Toller Fratrum Road- *no objections, this has been withdrawn.*

23/01-11. To consider any Highways matters

i. Update on Green Lane issues- AS explained that the issues of green laning has escalated over the Christmas period, it has become anti-social tourism and issues of a noise nuisance and livestock worrying. This has been reported to Rights of Way and Dorset Council, it was explained that as the route concerned is an Unclassified Road then this is a highways matter, Dave Carey highways officer has been contacted to consider this matter further. AS explained that the route is not complete and the land ownership of the area is to be clarified. Further investigation is required, Clerk to follow up with highways.

23/01-12. To consider Rights of way matters-

- ii. Update on finger posts- AS reported he is making progress and it is hoped to be completed and up in Feb. CS commented on the works carried out at the top of the hill at Compton Lane by CS and JR repairing fingerposts, with plastic letters but perfectly serviceable to find that another group had made changes to the finger posts and replaced the plastic with metal lettering. CS explained that as the finger posts are now Parish responsibility it would have been good if the Parish Council had been consulted on these repairs.

23/01-13. To consider any correspondences received and previously circulated.

- i. Update on the Ammonite meeting- following the meeting where it was announced that the surgery is closing one day a week on a Thursday, the surgery provided the Parish reps with information on the closure to publicise in the villages. There is a real shortage of doctors in the country and the practice has had issues recruiting Doctors to cover all 3 of the surgeries covered by Ammonite.
- ii. Plans for Public Spaces- the PC received an email on information for village gateways no action at this stage.
