Internal Control Objective B

Reason for NO response to IC objective

Despite also being reminded by my predecessor in previous years the council do not correctly follow para 6.5 of their Financial Regulations regarding the correct authorisation of cheques and invoices for payment and many cheques have no signatures on the stubs and neither invoices or schedules for payment are correctly authorised on each occasion. The minutes do reflect authorisation but not signatories.

INTERNAL Control Objective H

Reason for NO response to IC objective

The asset register seems to show a combination of values which do not reflect the original acquisition value of the assets. I have asked the Council to carry out a revision of the register and to revalue at acquisition cost as well as replacement and insurance value.

INTERNAL Control Objective K

Reason for qualified N/A response to IC objective

The Parish Clerk assures me that the Parish Council are only Guardian Trustee of the Charity Commission Trust No 517889 – Acton Trussell Bednall, Teddesley Hay Community Centre. It appears however that the Parish Council exercises many financial responsibilities which makes it behave as though it is in fact either a managing or a sole trustee (eg payment of insurance, discharge of indebtedness etc). I have asked the council to obtain a copy of the governing document (dated 5 August 1986) from the Charity Commission and to take opinion from the Commission as to the actual status of the Parish Council in relation to the trust.
