CHAIR'S UPDATE

Firstly, may we wish you a very happy (and hopefully better!) New Year. We do hope you had a peaceful Christmas despite these difficult times. As the new COVID-19 vaccines get rolled out, perhaps 2021 will be the beginning of 'normal life' again for us all. Oh, for a hug!

Although 2020 has been a horrendous year for all sorts of reasons, one of the good things that has come out is the increased sense of community in our country and how so many people have stepped up to help each other. We can be so proud in our village of how we all rallied round to help those who were isolating, lonely or feeling down. A big shout out again to all the volunteers at St Mary's Church, the Hub at the Community Shop, the Lunch Club and many villagers throughout Stoke who made sure that their neighbours got their shopping, prescriptions, dogs walked, dinners delivered, and who took the time to have a friendly chat or telephone call to others on a regular basis. Every single person made a difference to someone.

From the information the Government has released, we understand that the NHS will inform each of us exactly when our first vaccination is due and where that will be, so please don't ring Hamdon Medical Centre – we will all be notified in due course. The doctor's surgery is always very busy during winter months.

At our Zoom meeting in December, we were pleased to agree to a grant of £830 to the Memorial Hall Trustees for their building insurance (something we do each year for the village hall).

We also agreed to ask our Parish Ranger to work some extra hours in December and January round the village. This will help speed up the work clearing any blocked drains ahead of the winter worst weather. He will also be continuing to remove weeds from gutters, one road at a time. Both these jobs are no longer done by County Highways and the District Council due to their budget and staffing restraints, so we have to pay for these jobs ourselves. We have purchased and installed a new litter bin at the top of Windsor Lane to replace the one that disappeared and ordered a new dog bin at the entrance of the Memorial Hall Grounds to replace the one that was damaged.

Following the trial use of a flashing Speed Indicator Device round the village over the past couple of months, we have now ordered our own Device, and hopefully this will be in use late December/early January. The device will be moved round various agreed locations every two weeks by the Parish Ranger and a volunteer Parish Councillor.
