Firms that give donations include M & S, Booking.com, Amazon, e-bay, John Lewis, Boots and Currys. However six thousand retailers are part of the scheme.

Drawings of the Park - 1888

The two illustrations below are taken from an article in the Graphic, published in August 1888. The newspaper had a double page spread of drawings of Scarborough and the surrounding area as part of a series of articles about summer holiday resorts.

The drawing below shows the pond looking towards the Abbey Flats and also the path that used to run round the far side. The Victorian figures are quite fascinating.
