Wolds Ward Barnoldby- le-Beck Update September 2017

Crime

There have been 56 crimes reported across the whole of the Wolds Ward from 1st July to 1st September. There have been six reports in Barnoldby-le-Beck.

Overnight 5th & 6th July a garage at a property on Willow Park was entered. A car within the garage was searched, but nothing was stolen

During the afternoon of 1st August a group of youths caused damage to hay bales in a field at Grange Farm Riding School.

Other crime include two assaults among family members and an assault on a police officer who attended the scene.

A report of harassment following a long running neighbour dispute

There have been four reports of ASB. Two relate to youths messing around in the fields of Grange Farm Riding School, and two relate to a long running neighbour dispute.
