I have been asked to raise the issue of who currently leads on organising events surrounding Remembrance Day in Chideock. This follows from this years cancellation by StGiles, ( due to COVID), of the usual Remembrance Day event. You may be aware that regardless of this decision by StGiles, the Parish council went ahead with a socially distanced event at the war memorial and a number of villagers attended although the event was not advertised as such. Subsequently, Chideock Parish council discussed what had happened and whether the actual Remembrance Day event could in future be led by a joint approach with the Parish Council. It was clear from the feedback that villagers have shared with the Parish council that it was felt that some type of event should have taken place. The Parish Council are very happy to lead on this in partnership with both St Giles and the Catholic Church, but clearly we all need to be in agreement about how this could be jointly organised and how it would be communicated to the village. I hope that the PPC are able to consider our proposal and if you need further discussion then I would be happy to attend the PPC to explain. In the interim, the Parish council have taken responsibility for maintaining the war memorial. Let us know you thoughts."

This year for the first time because of the Covid restrictions the PCC decided that social distancing by the A-35 and the risk that we did not know how many people might turn up was not advisable or legal. Instead ,we arranged for the wreath laying to be done as a symbolic act in St Giles, as we have done occasionally when the weather has been wet. This was advertised , as always in the Parish Magazine, but unfortunately at the last minute the Government banned church services. I in fact laid a wreath on behalf of St Giles shortly after 11.00 am.</p> <p>2. Every year we liaise with the Catholic church about the Service and they come along and share the wreath laying and indeed I spoke with Gaby from their church this year.</p> <p>3. It is interesting that during the many years I have been involved with this ceremony I have seldom seen more than one Councillor at the Remembrance</p> <p>4. The PCC feel that this event is always well advertised and that there is no need for another layer of bureaucracy. Of course the Parish Council is always free to take part and contribute. This year has obviously been distorted by the Covid effect on public events, hence the confusion felt by Councillors and we hope for a return to normality as soon as possible."</p>
