Following a Chimney Fire in the Kings Head pub on Thursday evening it seems appropriate that a repeat of the following article that first appeared in Malherbe Monthly last September might be worth another read!!

"Don't give us the brush off, sign up to alerts and avert a fire" say firefighters

Kent Fire and Rescue Service (KFRS) is launching a new free, email alert system to help keep you, your home and business safe from chimney fires.

Between 2010 and 2014, KFRS tackled almost 1,350 chimney fires around the county. From KFRS research carried out earlier this summer, one in three people who responded to a KFRS online survey* said that they hadn't had their chimney swept in over a year, if at all.

Head of Community Safety, Lee Rose, said: "Chimneys can turn into blazing furnaces when they catch fire, causing thousands of pounds worth of damage and putting your home, family and business at risk.

"We're launching the clean sweep alert—it's safe and easy-to-use and you can sign up in seconds. It will send you a message to remind you to get your chimney cleaned and inspected if you haven't already had it done yet. That way you can make sure it's free from debris and in good working order before you light it when the weather cools down. This will help to prevent fires and structural damage to your property."

If you have a chimney, open fire, wood burner, Aga or other 'real flame' appliance, it's vital that you ensure it is properly installed and serviced by competent engineers, so you can safely curl up next to a warm, cosy fire throughout the colder winter months.

Lee added: "The risk of carbon monoxide poisoning can occur at any time, in any home or enclosed space. Blocked flues and chimneys can prevent carbon monoxide escaping, allowing it to reach dangerous levels. Make sure you don't get caught out by a silent killer. Proper care and maintenance will allow you to enjoy the benefits of using your fireplace safely and, as it will run more efficiently, it could save you money too!

"Don't take chances with safety, sign up for the free clean sweep alert and get your chimney and flues inspected and swept annually. Follow our common sense chimney fire safety advice and keep your home and business fires burning safely this winter."

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great Spring dish and goes great with new potatoes. Just a little care required when flambéing.

Flambéed Chicken & Asparagus

4 boneless, skinless, chicken breasts

1 tablespoon of plain flour 2 tablespoons of olive oil

1 knob of butter

4 shallots, finely chopped

4 tablespoons of brandy 300ml of chicken stock asparagus spears, halved 1 tablespoons of crème fraîche 1 tablespoon of chopped tarragon

1. Dust the chicken with the flour. Heat the oil and butter in a large, wide pan with a lid, add the chicken, and fry on all sides until nicely browned. Add the shallots, then fry for about 2 minutes until they start to soften, but not colour. Pour in the brandy and carefully ignite, (stand well back until the flames have died down). Stir in the stock and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat, cover, then cook for 15 minutes until the chicken is just tender.

2. Add the asparagus to the sauce. Cover, then cook for a further 5 minutes more until tender. Stir in the crème fraîche and tarragon and warm through. Season to taste.



Christian Message May 2016

What did, or does your father mean to you? The shops are already full of cards for father's day which, this year will be on Sunday June 19th. Maybe you are beginning to think if you might be marking the occasion this year, and how you might be doing this. My own Father died several years ago now, but I still like to give thanks for him. And now I watch my children as they show their appreciation for their father, all year round. Of course, this is how it should be in a loving family with good father role models. I wonder what sort of father you had.

Our Father ... the first two words of the Lord's Prayer. They are words that Jesus of Nazareth taught his followers to say. Do you ever wonder what sort of Father he is, our Father God?

As I have visited some of you in your homes I have seen how wonderfully close some of you are to your fathers who might now be elderly. I remember one father who was carer for his wife, she was suffering with Alzheimer's, and he himself was becoming isolated as he cared for her, but how he loved to spend time with his daughter when she visited them. It was such a joy to see their closeness, their fondness for each other.

This daughter and her father didn't always agree. They argued about all sorts of things, mostly about football and politics, and who made the best coffee. Do you wonder if Jesus meant us to think of God as that sort of father? Someone we can argue with? We might not always understand what he is thinking, but it is okay to talk to him about that and still love him, just as the daughter I mentioned did with her father.

But Jesus said *our* Father, not *my* father. He said Our Father in heaven. That's what I'm suggesting is important. Not my father but ours, mine, yours, everybody's! Maybe you would like to explore what sort of Father he really is? Maybe you think that Jesus, our Lord meant that our heavenly Father is like all the best bits of everybody's dad, all rolled into one. Good, like the father I remember caring for his wife as he carefully held the cup to her lips to make sure that she had enough to drink.

Or maybe you think he should be like another father of a younger family that I'm thinking of. It seems to me that this father lets his children do what they like, he would say, because he loves them, but Our Father can help us see that 'doing our own thing' can bring pain to others, and actually it isn't good for us or our world either! Our Father in heaven does give us guidance to follow. He is our role model and Jesus has taught us about him.

Maybe Our Father hopes that we will find out more about him maybe even go to church or say some prayers and give him thanks for being the sort of Father he is. Do you wonder if Our Father laughs when we're all happy together, as my father used to. And do you wonder if Our Father is there with us in our disappointments and our

sadness as well. As Christians we know him to be our loving Father who is always there for us.

I suppose the best bit is that Our Father is *ours*, whatever our own dad is or has been like. Even if we have never known our earthly father. Yes, our Father in heaven is *ours!* All we have to do is recognize him as just that. Whatever you might be experiencing at this moment, whether it's grief, sadness, of sheer joy I encourage you to share your feelings with Our Father.

So, Lord Jesus, thank you for sharing your Father with us and for telling us that he is our Father too. Thank you for letting us know that he thinks of each one of us as one of His family. God, our Father, thank you for being Father to all of us. Help us today to live as one family. Help us make you laugh with pleasure, and help us to love others the way you love us. Amen.


