Incidents of Note:

Shopliftings: In the Month of April, Kent Police received five reports of Theft / Shoplifting from Co-Op, Aylesham. Please contact Kent Police on 101 or Crimestoppers confidentially if you have any information in relation to those responsible. Investigations are ongoing. There will be an increased police presence around this location and positive action will be taken against those identified for such offences.

Off Road Motorcycles: Several reports of nuisance off road motorcycles were received over the month of April. These were from Eythorne and also the vicinity of the old colliery at Snowdown. Please ensure such activity is reported to Kent Police direct (via 101 or Kent Police Website) and not solely reported on social media. When located, every effort is made to stop these vehicles, and the rider will be prosecuted for identified driving offences.

Criminal Damage: Terrace Road, Elvington: On 14th April 2026, a report of criminal damage was made to Kent Police. A window of a residential dwelling was damaged by person(s) unknown. The damage appeared to have been caused by a projectile, either from an air weapon or a catapult. Crime reference 46/59475/26 refers.

Fraud: On 27th April 2026, a report of fraud was made to Kent Police. An item was sold on a social media selling platform. The buyer has collected this expensive item from Aylesham and paid for this with fake £20 banknotes. Sadly, this was only realised by the seller after the exchange had taken place. Cad 27:1141 refers and police enquiries are still ongoing. If selling an item, I would suggest a bank transfer is the safest option. With internet banking, this can be seen in real time in your account prior to handing over the goods. If cash is preferred, take time to check these and use the Bank Of England website for details of how to easily identify forged bank notes – website: bankofengland.co.uk
