Progress Update February 2016

The feedback from the questionnaire sent to all residents in 2014 formed the basis of the Fletching Parish Action Plan, which sets out a vision for the future of the parish. Since the plan was produced in January 2015, we have been working hard to address the issues raised with over 50% success to date. We have also begun to look at long-term projects that will enhance our rural parish.

This document gives you an update on our progress over the past year and identifies what else still needs to be done. Items that have been greyed out are complete for the year, although some things will continue to be reviewed on a regular basis.

The Steering Group that drives this initiative is made up of parish councillors and volunteers from the community and everyone is welcome to participate. We have worked closely with the parish council, Wealden District Council, East Sussex County Council, Sussex Police and various local groups and organisations. We have also held public meetings on road safety, parking in Fletching village and an exciting new annual community event called Fletching Festival.

The amount that we achieve is dependent upon the number of volunteers that we have, so we are always looking for additional volunteers to help us get things done.
