HISTORICAL SOCIETY

I wrote in my summer newsletter "Roll on the summer". However, I did not expect it to be this hot and I hope you are all surviving the unusually high temperatures. We are now in our summer recess for monthly meetings and will commence the 2026/2027 season on Friday 25th September. Attendance at the Historical Society's monthly meetings during the last year has been great, averaging well over 70 people joining us for the talks. The membership was 108. Regular attendance indicates we continue to provide a diverse, engaging program of talks.

As Tony Irvine, our chairman, said at our AGM in June, the society has managed very well through the period of high inflation and indeed the accounts remain stable. However, speaker fees have shown a big increase at 34% over the previous year. Our reserves have been stable due to our level of membership and the large numbers turning up at the meetings and also sales of the society's publications. Because of this we are pleased to confirm there will be no increase in our subscription fees or the cost of entry for the 2026/2027 season of meetings. The programme up to and including November 2026 is shown below and thanks to Tony Irvine for arranging these talks.

Please look out for the postings on the EWT Facebook page where we post more details of each meeting in the week leading up to each monthly meeting.

We will commence taking membership for the 2026/2027 season from the September meeting. If you wish to renew your membership or to join the society the fees are £5 for a family membership and £3 for a single membership and the meeting fee of £2 per member and £3 for non-members for the coming year. Doors open at 7:30pm and coffee/tea will be available at no additional cost.

The site contains a great deal of information about the history of Weston Turville, copies of old postcards, links to other relevant historical sites etc. Our website has drawn praise from a number of people over the years. It has been updated to include some further material and is a great resource along with the archive which we are in the process of reorganising.

Aston Reach Moving Forward: Safer Streets, Better Spaces and a Thriving Community



There is plenty to celebrate at Aston Reach as a series of exciting developments are helping to make our neighbourhood safer, more accessible and even more vibrant for residents.

20mph Speed Limit Agreed

ARRA recently held a highly productive meeting with Taylor Wimpey, where an important agreement was reached to introduce a **20mph speed limit throughout the estate**. This welcome change will improve road safety for everyone, particularly children, pedestrians, cyclists and families.

The meeting also reinforced a positive working relationship between ARRA and Taylor Wimpey. The developer has committed to meeting again with ARRA to discuss further remedial works required across the estate, ensuring residents' concerns continue to be heard and addressed.

Improving Our Estate

Visible improvements are already underway, with MV Kelly now commencing remedial works across Aston Reach in earnest.

Teams are repairing cracked and failing pavements, replacing missing dropped textured kerbs to improve accessibility, and carrying out essential works to enhance the quality of the estate's infrastructure.

Residents will also be pleased to hear that drainage issues affecting the playground have been significantly improved through the installation of French drains, helping to keep the area safer and more usable throughout the year.

A Summer Full of Community Spirit

While improvements continue across the estate, the Aston Reach Ward has also enjoyed a fantastic summer of community activities.

Residents have taken part in a relaxing Yoga Day, promoting health and wellbeing, while the colourful Hari Nama Festival brought music, culture and a wonderful atmosphere to Aston Reach, attracting families and neighbours from across the community.

The momentum continues, with even more exciting community events already being planned for the coming months. These initiatives are helping to bring people together, strengthen neighbourhood connections and make Aston Reach an even better place to live.

As ARRA continues to work alongside Taylor Wimpey, FirstPort, local contractors and community partners, we're delighted to see real progress being made. Thank you to everyone who has supported these initiatives—we look forward to sharing more positive updates as Aston Reach continues to move forward.

If your event is likely to affect public roads or grounds, you may need permission to implement a road closure, install safety signage, and arrange appropriate insurance to ensure public safety.

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Planning Applications – A Reminder About Buckinghamshire's Planning Portal

Buckinghamshire Council's new planning portal is now fully in use, making it easier for residents to search planning applications, view plans, track decisions and submit comments online.

If you wish to comment on a planning application, remember that only **material planning considerations** can be taken into account by planning officers. These include matters such as:

- Traffic, parking and highway safety
- Impact on neighbouring properties, including privacy and loss of light
- The scale, design and appearance of the development
- Flood risk, trees, wildlife and other environmental issues
- Access, footpaths and local infrastructure

Issues such as personal disputes, the effect on property values, loss of a private view or land ownership are **not** material planning considerations and cannot influence the planning decision.

Important Reminder

Under Buckinghamshire Council's new planning system, **Parish Councils can no longer see comments submitted by residents through the planning portal.**

If you would like Weston Turville Parish Council to be aware of your views on a planning application, please email a copy of your comments, or let us know your concerns, at clerk@westonturville-pc.gov.uk. This helps the Parish Council understand local opinion when preparing its own response to planning applications.

Residents are encouraged to stay involved in planning matters affecting the Parish. By submitting well-informed comments and keeping the Parish Council informed, you can help shape future development in Weston Turville.

The magic of Merlin in Weston Turville

A little birdie told me about this cool app called **Merlin**.



Have you heard of it?

What is the Merlin app?

Merlin identifies any birds that you can see or hear.

It's a hoot. Especially because we can't usually see the birds.

The app on your phone picks up the sounds of the birds nearby and starts displaying the pictures and names of each bird it identifies. I had no idea that there were so many different birds in our neighbourhood.

I find that using the app makes me feel mindful of our village and the true magic we are surrounded by...

It helps bring your awareness to the sounds around you. Sometimes it surprises you by displaying 2 or 3 birds at the same time — forcing you to listen more intently and become aware that there are distinctly different chirps and tweets in the background.

When a bird I have never heard of before shows up on my screen, it makes me feel calm and grateful to be a part of such a beautiful village.

Nature's Symphony

I realise there are a lot of things around me that I take for granted.

I've heard these birds my whole life but up until now, I paid little attention to them. The more you listen, the more you hear. The variety of sounds and colours of birds is kind of mind-blowing. It's sometimes disappointing that you cannot see them, I cannot say I have a favourite spot in the village to hear them but I am constantly thinking I should make a map of where they all are, maybe if you would like to join me in working this out that would be great.

The sounds of birds are relaxing once you stop and listen to them.

If you want to learn more about any of the birds that pop up, you can click on their image and a short description is shown on screen. There are also audio clips of each bird's sounds that you can re-listen to if interested.

Please give the magic Merlin app a go. I believe it:

Promotes mindfulness. Provides information about the things you may take for granted. Makes you feel in awe of nature and curious about the world around you.

I'd love to hear your stories about using the app if you decide to try it.

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HGV Construction Traffic

The Parish Council has been in contact with Hampden Fields, HS2, Buckinghamshire Council, and several haulage companies to raise concerns from residents about construction traffic driving through the Village.

If you see what you believe to be HS2 or Hampden Fields construction traffic coming through the Village, the following information is required to address any complaints:



Lorry registration number

Date of sighting

Time of sighting

Photo (only if it is safe to take one)



PLEASE NOTE:

- Without all of the above information, the developers are unable to investigate complaints and take appropriate action.
- Although large developments such as HS2 and Hampden Fields have traffic management plans this does not prevent other HGVs from using the public highway through the village.

Reporting Instructions:

If the lorry displays an HS2 sign on the dashboard email: hs2enquiries@hs2.org.uk including all the information listed above and please copy in clerk@westonturville-pc.gov.uk so the Parish Council are aware of all the complaints and can follow up if needed.

For Hampden Fields traffic issues email: clerk@westonturville-pc.gov.uk
Again, please include the full details.

HS2: What Residents Need to Know This Autumn

For many Weston Turville residents, HS2 remains one of the biggest long-term issues affecting everyday life. Although much of the railway itself lies beyond the parish, construction continues across Buckinghamshire and the Wendover area, bringing ongoing roadworks, traffic management measures and heavy construction vehicles to local roads.

As work progresses, residents travelling towards Wendover and along the A413 corridor may continue to experience delays caused by temporary traffic controls and engineering works. HS2's interactive online route map provides up-to-date information on current and planned construction activity, road closures and highway impacts, helping motorists plan journeys before they set off.

Listening to Local Communities

In recent months, HS2's Chief Executive, Mark Wild, has acknowledged concerns raised by communities along the route. During meetings with residents in the Wendover area, he indicated that HS2 is committed to developing a more direct and proactive relationship with the communities most affected by the project.

Many local residents hope this approach will lead to better communication as construction continues.

Construction Traffic

One of the most common concerns raised by residents remains the number of heavy goods vehicles using local roads.

People living in Weston Turville, Wendover and neighbouring villages continue to report increased HGV movements associated with HS2 and other major construction projects taking place across the area.

Developers are required to follow approved construction traffic routes, with strict planning conditions designed to prevent construction vehicles travelling through Weston Turville unnecessarily. When residents report suspected breaches, Weston Turville Parish Council passes these concerns to Buckinghamshire Council and the relevant developers for investigation.

While disruption cannot always be avoided during projects of this scale, the Parish Council continues to monitor concerns raised by residents and works with the appropriate authorities wherever possible.

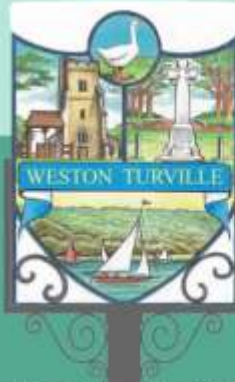
Planning Ahead

If you're travelling through the area over the coming months, a little planning can help avoid unnecessary delays.

Residents are encouraged to:

- Allow extra time when travelling towards Wendover or the A413.
- Check planned roadworks before longer journeys.
- Report potholes, damaged roads or highway issues through Buckinghamshire Council's online reporting system.

Although HS2 construction will continue for some time yet, keeping informed about planned works can help reduce disruption and make day-to-day travel a little easier.

The Widow Turpin's Charity is a small local run charity established in 1736 with the ability to help persons in need who reside in the Parish of Weston Turville.

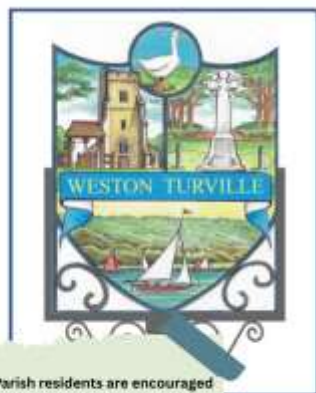

TREES, HEDGES AND A GREENER PARISH

Volunteers Needed This October

Weston Turville Parish Council is continuing its environmental and climate-focused work, and one of the biggest opportunities for residents to get involved this autumn will be local tree and hedge planting projects.



The Parish Council's Climate Action work remains an active part of parish planning, and community tree planting is expected to play an important role in improving biodiversity, supporting wildlife corridors and helping the parish remain green as new development continues around the parish.

KEEP AN EYE ON PARISH UPDATES – GET INVOLVED – HELP OUR PARISH GROW

APPLE CHUTNEY

A sweet, tangy and warming chutney made with simple ingredients.

Perfect with cheese, cold meats or as a tasty gift from the kitchen.

INGREDIENTS

- 4lb apples after peeling and coring (about 2 large cooking apples)
- 2 lbs Demerara sugar
- 1 ½ pints of vinegar
- 1 oz salt
- 1 teaspoon of ground ginger
- ½ oz of all spice
- 1 teaspoonful of cayenne pepper

METHOD

- 1 Mince apples after peeling and put in a large saucepan.
- 2 Add sugar, vinegar, salt, ginger, all spice and cayenne pepper, and simmer until tender.
- 3 Continue to simmer, uncovered, until the mixture thickens and is jam-like.
- 4 Stir occasionally to prevent sticking.
- 5 Spoon into sterilised jars while hot, seal tightly and store in a cool, dark place.
- 6 Leave for a few weeks before enjoying – the flavours will continue to develop.

10 STEPS TO SAVE YOU energy & money

01. Switch off standby

You can save around £45 in GB annually just by remembering to turn your appliances off standby mode.

Professional draught-proofing of windows, doors and blocking cracks in floors and skirting boards can save around £80

02. Draught-proof windows and doors



03. Turn off lights

Turn your lights off when you're not using them or when you leave a room. This will save you around £7 in GB on your annual energy bills.

You can save around £24 in GB a year on your energy bill by using your washing machine on a 30-degree cycle instead of higher temperatures. Reduce your washing machine use by one run per week for a year.

05. Avoid the tumble dryer

Avoid using a tumble dryer for your clothes. Drying clothes on racks inside where possible or outside in warmer weather can save you £50 a year.

Keeping your shower time to just 4 minutes could save a typical household £55 in GB a year.

06. Spend less time in the shower



07. Swap your bath for a shower

Some of us might enjoy a long soak in the bath. But swapping just one bath a week with a 4-minute shower could save you £9 in GB a year.

Kettles are one of the most used appliances in the kitchen. But many of us will admit that we occasionally boil the kettle with more water than we're going to use. Avoid overfilling the kettle and you can save yourself £10 in GB a year.

08. Be savvy in the kitchen



09. Fill your dishwasher

Only run your dishwasher when it's to full reduce the amount of water you use. Reducing your dishwasher use by one run per week for a year could save you £12 in GB a year.

Effective insulation of your hot water cylinder is important. If you have thin spray foam or a loose 25mm jacket, you can benefit from increasing the insulation to a British Standard Jacket (80mm thick). Doing this will help you save £40 in GB a year. Insulating your water tank, pipes and radiators is a quick and easy way to save money on your bills.

(July 2026) Updates

Please find below updates regarding Hampden Fields. All of the updates detailed are subject to planning, and timescales may vary depending on this process.

Notes:

- Offsite works and site establishment for the A41 roundabout works were completed in spring and summer 2026.
- Over recent months, the contractor has made progress on the final stretch of the Southern Link Road and the north side of the roundabout being built to appropriate, agreed levels.
- On-site work to construct the new A41 roundabout and associated road infrastructure will begin in autumn 2026.
- It is anticipated that the Southern Link Road between the A41 and A413 will open in early 2027, and will be aligned with the completion of the A41 Woodlands Roundabout.
- The show homes and sales office of the Hampden Fields East development, which is located just off the A41, are now open, with the first residents set to move into their new homes in autumn 2026.
- Taylor Wimpey donated £1,000 to Henry Floyd Grammar School's music department fund, and was recently a sponsor for the school's Celebration of Achievement Awards.

An EV Club for Wendover and the Villages of Stoke Mandeville, Weston Turville and Halton

The Parish Councils of Wendover, Stoke Mandeville, Weston Turville and Halton are considering funding an exciting new initiative, a joint EV (Electric Vehicle) Club in collaboration with Wendover and Villages Community Climate Action groups. The project would be run by ZIMBL, following their current successful model in Haddenham and Banbury. This model has no annual membership fee and works on a mileage cost of £8 per hour capped at £80 per day, including delivery of an EV to your door and collection after use. First-time users would be given a full brief on how the car and the app work.

The aim is to provide residents with a car when needed for as long as needed. It is a service that could save you money, whilst helping you to drive cleaner, more environmentally friendly vehicles. Parishes could also benefit from a reduction of cars parked on the street.
