# MINUTES OF A MEETING OF BISHOPS CAUNDLE PARISH COUNCIL

# HELD ON TUESDAY, 15<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER, 2016 AT 7.30P.M. IN THE VILLAGE HALL

1	TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES:	
1.	Apologies were received from Cllr. Matthew Hall, Cllr. Gould, R. Meade and L.	
	Coombe	
2.	TO APPROVE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:	
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	The minutes of the meeting held on 20 <sup>th</sup> September 2016 were approved and	
	signed by the Chairman, having been circulated previously. Proposed L. Lyon,	
	Seconded T. Loveless.	
3.	MATTERS ARISING THEREFROM:	
	Hedge alongside playing field: This has now been cut, apart from the inside of the	
	hedge between Windy Ridge and the play area. Mr. Bennett to be asked to cut	
	this next year.	
4.	BLACKMORE VALE LIONS – HALF MARATHON:	
	Colin MacLeod and Ian Simpson confirmed there were no changes to	
	arrangements but concerns about the use of the recreation ground following the	
	loss of the Football Club. The Parish Council had consulted Sarah Martin and she	
	thought she would be able to find some helpers. Mr. MacLeod has been given	
	contact numbers for Sarah and Terry Loveless for the gate key.	
	Cllr. Dicker suggested the Lions donate to the Social Club instead of the Football	
	Club. Cllr. Loveless emphasised concerns about the deep ruts left in 2015. Mr.	
	MacLeod said the Football Club had had money given to them for reinstatement,	
	but this has not been done. Ideally the grass on the lower part of the field needs	
	cutting nearer the time. Cllr. Tuffin emphasised the value of the event to the	
	village.	
	Mr. MacLeod and Mr Simpson left the meeting at 8.20p.m.	
5.	POST OFFICE PROGRESS/DONATION REQUEST:	
	Cllr. Lyon reported that alterations and meetings were progressing nicely. Cllr.	
	Lyon had done the online training which took 14 hours but 20 is the average. Two	
	applicants need to go to Bristol for two day training which would require two	
	overnight stays due to timing and traffic. Two nights in a Travelodge plus staff	
	hours plus fuel would cost approximately £366 + or minus hours for internet	
	training.	
	Holwell Parish Council had been approached for help with these costs, they were	
	very supportive but no financial help was forthcoming. In future, the shop should	
	be able to afford to pay for future staff if there is a change but at the present	
	time, there are a lot of expenses coming at the same time.	
	Money previously given to the shop was for shelving and a chiller cabinet.	
	All Parish Councillors have signed Dispensation forms and have declared an	
	interest as shareholders.	
	Cllr. Jones said the power S137 would allow for money to be spent for the benefit	
	of the whole community.	
	Cllr. Loveless proposed to give the Community Shop £300, seconded by A. Tuffin,	
	and this was agreed.

0.	Cllr. Lyon had attended the A.G.M. and reported that it had been very Sherborne oriented. The new Chair lives in Milborne Port, so villages may become more	

	involved. Holwell Parish Council have suggested that Bishops Caundle and	
	Holwell worked together on certain projects. Councillors were supportive of	
	Holwell's proposed development which would bring in more people for the	
	school and the church. Clerk will notify Holwell.	Clk
7.	NEW PLUS BUS SERVICE:	
	Plus Bus has introduced a service which is a fare payable service and not, at	
	present, accepting bus passes. It runs from Blandford to Sherborne. Barry	
	Williams has reported frustration with routes and suggested local villages get	
	together to lobby councillors to stop withdrawal of services. Cllr. Dicker proposed	
	to find out about Plus Bus and put details on website, seconded by A. Tuffin.	Clk
	Clerk to follow this up and investigate posters etc.	
8.	FOOTBALL/SOCIAL CLUB:	
	Legal advice is being sought from DAPTC. The Football Club have been asked to	
	formally give up the lease.	
	The clerk will write to the Social Club to ask about their intentions and any	
	proposals to take the Football situation forward, after the DAPTC advice has	Clk
	arrived.	
9.	PLAYAREA – MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS:	
J.	Mr. Bingham has been given a cheque for the materials but due to the delay after	
	the Parish Council asked for a breakdown of his hours, he took on another job so	
	has not yet started in the playarea. The cheque has not yet been banked. Cllr.	
	Loveless will ask him if he can give a date for getting started and he will also	
	spray the weeds with weedkiller. Inspection has been delayed until the work has	
	been done.	
	Some names have been put forward and it is hoped enthusiastic parents will get	
	together and start an initiative towards new equipment. Cllr. Lyon will do a	
	newsletter from the shop asking for interested parties to come forward and the

10.	VILLAGE HALL:	
	Cllr. Jones reported that under the rules of the Village Hall Constitution, if the	
	committee fails the management will fall onto the Parish Council and if that fails,	
	the District Council would take over with all monies as well.	
	The hall committee is managed by 'aged' persons who have been on the	
	committee for a long time and the secretary/treasurer are likely to resign at the	
	A.G.M. Cllr.Dicker pointed out that the clerk would ultimately have to be paid	
	extra which would have a financial implication on the village. Cllr. Lyon said the	
	shop could deal with the bookings.	
	5 estimated have been obtained for external redecoration, the cheapest is £750	
	with no V.A.T. The toilets will also be redecorated, the same colour which is	
	cheaper. Cllr. Tuffin asked about representatives from other groups who use the	
	hall but Cllr. Jones said they were unwilling to do this. Cllr. Tuffin asked if monthly	
	meetings were necessary and Cllr. Jones said they could be bi-monthly.	
	Cllr. Lyon suggested the Parish Council add a letter to go with the Shop flyer	
	including urgent issues such as the playarea and the Village Hall.
