As previously reported, the pandemic has had an ongoing impact on the Hall. This time last year we were looking forward to reopening, and indeed we did, only to close again and then reopen again. And here we are now with the Hall fully open and very pleased to welcome back all of our regular hirers. We are also pleased to also welcome a new regular hirer delivering bi-monthly seated exercise classes.


A detailed financial position is reported on separately, but it is pleasing to note that our income is slowly climbing back to pre-pandemic levels and our many years of good financial governance and control, assisted by financial assistance from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council for which we are again very grateful, sees us going into 2022 in a good shape.

With this gradual return to normality, we managed to host a Village Picnic at the end of July, an event enjoyed by all. We used this opportunity to say thank you to our village postman, Mick, and to present him with a gift from the village to wish him the very best in retirement. My thanks to Darren and Jo Capehorn and Carina Barker for arranging what everyone agreed was a very enjoyable event.

At the end of the year we welcomed the Cliddesden Players back when they performed the 2021 Christmas Pantomime entitled 'A Knight on the Tiles.. Recycled', an update of a panto first written and performed in 2004. It was great to see the Players back on stage, this being the first panto since 2019 with no summer plays being staged in 2020 or 2021, and as always my heartfelt thanks goes to the Players for their continued support for the Hall.

In the background we have spent a huge amount of time continuing to maintain and update the various COVID related documentation that we put in place in 2020, with hardly a month going by when we didn't have to review yet more Government guidance and regulations. And for this, my thanks again goes to Julie James, Angie Fewster and Jo Capehorn who continued through 2021 picking apart all the guidance in order to see how it affected the Hall.

As I note every year, the successful running of the Hall is dependent on a good team, and on that thought thanks are due to a number of people.



Firstly to Pat and Ken Rampton for their continued engagement throughout the year: Pat for managing the regular and one-off lets when we were allowed to open and Ken along with James Piper and Annie Houstoun for opening and closing the Hall and keeping it clean and tidy. And more thanks to James and Annie for the extra cleaning required by our COVID regimes.

My thanks also go to a number of other people not on the Committee but who nonetheless provide valuable assistance to the Hall:

NOTES FROM THE MARCH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Present all Parish Councillors and Clerk, five members of the public. Apologies from Ward and County Councillors and PCSO Andy Jones.

Report from Cllr Henderson on the Village 20mph project

The Hants Economy Transport Environment Select Committee working group is examining a 20mph countywide speed limit for villages and residential areas. They will report back later this year. The chair of the working group is Cllr Stephen Philpott. Should residents and supporters of 20mph like to contact him, his email is: Stephen.Philpott@hants.gov.uk

Neighbourhood Plan Regulation 14 Consultation (Draft NP)

document has been submitted to residents, businesses and statutory consultees. Consultation is from 15 February to 30 March (6 weeks). Issues raised will be considered – and addressed, incorporated and/or answered. Once this is completed, the Plan will be ready for Referendum.

Local Plan Update progress has been delayed – due to uncertainty over national policy and also to change of leadership. (Following Cllr Rhatigan's resignation, Simon Bound is now leader of the Council with Cllr John Izett as Deputy.) The present LPU schedule is to be considering housing in June, with Reg 18 Consultation for publication July / August.

Pond update The contractors were pulling out from the pond having left approximately eight feet untouched around the edge and citing concerns over puncturing the liner. They agreed to return with a standard digger to remove more but the water level will need to be lower so this might take some time.

Village gateway signage amended scheme agreed (new signage only, not including 'gates') – to include: Four new signs entering the Village – on left hand side at the 30mph signs on Farleigh road (Southlea) and Woods Lane, on the right hand side on Hackwood Lane approaching the Village Hall; replacing the sign on

Farleigh road by Manor farm. (Also adding a 'pedestrians in road' warning sign near the Village Hall).

Greening Campaign Agreed to present the Greening Campaign at the Parish Assembly. The Greening Campaign requires the support of the Parish Council but is for Community to lead on. Big differences can only be achieved from small actions taken by the whole Community joining together. Expert advice is funded by Hants County Council.

Jubilee Copse (Queen's Green Canopy) Following an offer from Lord Lymington – in his capacity as Chairman of the Farleigh Wallop Estate – for a tree to be planted for all Cliddesden residents, the Estate has provided a corner of the field close by the M3 to plant 576 native saplings.

POLICE UPDATE FROM PCSO ANDY JONES

Report of 16th March

There has been a spike in metal theft in the Basingstoke town and rural areas recently. Due to eagle-eyed members of the public a photo was obtained of the individual as well as the registration of the silver van used. The suspect was quickly identified and a marker placed on his vehicle to stop and progress.

Thames Valley police have intercepted the suspect and charged with disqualified driving which is something we were also able to confirm. Unfortunately TVP have not dealt with the thefts in question but we are aware that he will be attending a court on a date and time in question.

He will be dealt with for additional offences in the near future – including the theft of a radiator from Cliddesden and bolts removed from a metal fencing surrounding a property in Brown Candover. (It's believed the intention was to steal the supporting metal posts – fortunately these were concreted in.)

A report was received of a theft of a car which had been delivered from an agent selling the vehicle to a property in Brown Candover (cost of £47,425). The car has now been insured in Scotland and so being followed up by another force.

At approximately 1400 hours on Saturday 5th March, police were called to Herriard with reports of trespassers on a property. Hunting saboteurs were getting in the way of the organised hunt, disrupting the activities of those on the land and intimidating persons by filming them and being verbally aggressive – which ended with some pushing of persons in the process.

On 20th February a report was received of Criminal Damage caused to a wing mirror of a car. The mirror appeared to have been kicked off completely and required a full replacement.

On 12th February police received a report of Hare Coursing in Bradley. The land owner the next morning noticed tyre tracks over the land – no lines of enquiry.



Directed by David Jones, who worked mostly in the theatre. it stars anne Bancroft, anthony Hopkins and Judi Dench. produced by Bancroft's husband, Mel Brooks. the screenplay by Hugh Whitmore is taken from a compilation of letters between Helen Hanff and Frank Doel dating from 1949 to 1968. anthony Hopkins plays the role in his usual understated way.

The film received positive reviews from critics, as well as receiving numerous industry awards and nominations. Bancroft won the BaFta award for Best Actress for her portrayal of Helen Hanff; additionally, Judy Dench was nominated for Best Supporting Actress and Hugh Whitmore for Best Adapted Screenplay. Of the films in which she has appeared, Judy Dench said that this is one of her favourite. *84 Charing Cross Road* has become something of a cult classic among bibliophiles. The film has something of the atmosphere of *Shadowlands* also with Anthony Hopkins.

The African Queen is a 1951 adventure film adapted from the novel by CS Forester. The film was directed by John Huston and produced by Sam Spiegel and John Woolf. It stars Humphrey Bogart (who won the academy award for Best Actor, his only oscar) and Katharine Hepburn.

Bogart plays the captain of an old river steamer in Africa during the first world war – with his typical hard-bitten, care-worn style. the on-screen chemistry between the two stars is a joy.

Cliddesden Primary School

The week beginning Monday 7th of February was Children's Mental Health Week.

Each class engaged in some special activities to help children keep mentally well, using resources provided to us by Coram Life Education SCARF.

S - Safety
C - Caring
A - Achievement
R - Resilience
F - Friendship



On Friday 11th of February, to mark the end of the week, we held a special 'Wear your Scarf to School' day where the children wore a special or favourite scarf all day. SCARF is a big part of our health and wellbeing/PSHE curriculum where we learn about all the things we can do to keep ourselves physically and mentally healthy. Coram Life Education SCARF is a children's health and wellbeing that works throughout the UK to provide high-quality PSHE education for primary-age children.



Quad Kids

We had a very successful inter-house Quadkids competition. The children participated in a sprint race, a long distance race, speed

bounce and aiming competitions. In all, the children participated enthusiastically and showed great sportsmanship. Our sports leaders had their first opportunity to lead an event and did a brilliant job of encouraging and supporting children. They were extremely fair and conscientious time and score keepers. They were supported by our House Captains

A team of KS2 children took part in the cross country running at Down Grange.

There were large numbers of children from a wide range of Basingstoke schools and our team put in a determined effort on very muddy ground. The runners all displayed great team values and supported each other in the race. We are waiting for the results of the competition but they can all be very



Our Year 5 children had the opportunity to take part in Bikeability training.

This is the national cycle training programme supported and funded by the Department for Transport. The course builds the skills and confidence of children who can already ride. Bikeability can not only make children better cyclists - potentially for the rest of their lives - but can help with general confidence and independent thinking.

The first session was conducted on the playground where an assessment of ability took place, followed by on road cycling in the local area surrounding the school for the rest of the course. The main aim of the course being that the children will be able to make a short journey in a safer manner and be more aware of road safety issues.

Our Year 5/6 football team took part in a six-a-side competition in Millbrook, Southampton. The Premier League Primary Stars tournament involved schools who are linked with The Saints Foundation. Most of the schools were from the Southampton area and we were the only school from this part of the county.



The competition was tough and some of the schools were challenging to compete against. Although results did not go our way the children enjoyed the day out and competing for Cliddesden. They also enjoyed wearing our brand-new kit, donated by the Cliddesden and Farleigh Wallop Trust and riding in a minibus to the venue. Our thanks also to Phil Jeffs and Brighton Hill Community School for transporting us to this event.



We celebrated **World Book Day** in school. The children and staff came dressed as book characters and there were some super and inventive costumes. During the day the children took part in a range of book related activities and we had a whole school assembly where we talked about the importance and enjoyment of reading. Some of the children talked about who



they were dressed as and the books they had chosen.

At Cliddesden Primary School we have ensured that in all our classrooms there is a range of books, both fiction and nonfiction, that enrich our children's' understanding of diversity. This may be by subject or author. One of our favourites is 'The boy at the back of the class' by Onjali Rauf. It is about a boy who comes to London as a refugee and problems he faces making new friends, adapting to a new life and facing racial prejudice. It has helped us learn the difficult journeys that refugees undertake for education and safety.

Beggarwood Surgery Update

NHS App and online access via Patient Access

We apologise for ongoing problems with the NHS App and Patient Access services since Beggarwood Surgery (BW) merged with Camrose, Gillies & Hackwood Partnership (CGH). The issues were not caused by either Practice, but are technical issues with the software for each service. We have been working with the suppliers who run these services trying to resolve the issues.

NHS App

Patients who obtained access to the NHS App without the need for account details from BW should automatically continue to have access following the merger. Patients who needed account details from BW to register on the NHS App (prior to the merger) will need new account details. These can be emailed to patients following a request to the Practice. In some cases patients who have problems reconnecting to the NHS App may need to delete the app completely. This means not just from their phone, but go into the settings on the NHS App and delete it completely. Then re-register for the NHS App using their new account details.

Patient Access

All patients will need new account details for Patient Access. Patients are re-registering with CGH as the medical systems are merged and now under one organisation (ODS) code. The new account details are necessary as the ODS code for BW has changed to the CGH ODS code. The BW ODS code is no longer in use and will not be recognised when registering. The new account details ensure access remains secure and authenticated by the patient using new access codes sent to their email address.

Patients cannot re-register with Patient Access using an email account they have already used. If a patient tries to re-register with the same email address, they will receive the error message "email address already registered" as the system recognises the email address as already assigned to a patient.

The workaround to this issue is for the patient to do one of the following:

- Re-register using an alternative email address, if the patient has one. Then use their new account details to register.
- Re-register using the same email address. In order to do this the patient's account needs to be "closed" on the medical system at the Surgery first, reset and new account details sent to the patient. This permits the patient to re-register using their existing email address but with new codes. Patients will obtain the same access they had previously.

Christine Stanbury, PPG, very kindly agreed to work with me on resolving some of the issues patients have had with Patient Access. Thank you Christine for your help and patience in trialling solutions and resolving these issues.
