
SAVE ROUTE 18

Starlings are very common in April, and one of the earliest nesters. Although they look black at a distance, up close they have glossy purple and green patches.

Starlings are a bit nefarious with regard to mating and nesting, something they learnt off a Cuckoo I suspect, so we won't mention that! Starlings are famous for their flocks prior to nesting, where thousands can be seen making





patterns in the sky, this is known as a 'Murmuration'

Thanks to all that did attend. The date chosen was deliberately chosen to be earlier than in recent years - so that the



grass was shorter and the pesky litter could be seen more easily. We weren't disappointed, just under 30 black bin liners full of sorts of rubbish was collected. A wholly unscientific survey indicated that wine bottles were as prominent as ever, but we were down – so to speak - on mens' underpants. Noticeboards

You may have noticed that we are currently limited on noticeboards at the moment.... We do still have a fully functioning Parish Council notice board outside the village hall.

Village Hedge - The Green

After considerable discussion at Parish Council meetings since the need to carry out serious repair to the Village Green railings became unavoidable, it was duly decided by the public and Councillors that a beech hedge was the most economic, aesthetic and effective solution. It was planted back from the present fence to ensure that it did not affect road users' visibility on the corner.

In due course the hedge will replace the fence as it decays further and the intervening grass space could be planted with daffodils for the spring.

Recipe of the Month Apple Cake Tray Bake (Fingers)

Ingredients*	Method	
10oz / 280g plain flour	Grease or line a swiss roll (flat) tin	
2 teaspoons Baking Powder	Sift flour, baking powder and salt into bowl	
Pinch of Salt	Rub in margarine and add sugar	
5oz / 140g Margerine	Peel and chop apples (dice) and add to mixture	
5oz / 140g Brown		
Sugar	Mix in beaten egg and milk to form	
1lb / 450g Cooking	soft dough	
Apples	Turn into tin and spread out	
1 Egg**	Cook till golden brown in a hot oven ~180°C	
1 Tablespoon Miilk to		
mix	Cut into fingers when cold and dust	
Caster Sugar to sprinkle on top	with caster sugar	

*Original quantities are imperial, grams are approximate but close.

**An Imperial or Metric egg can be used!
