FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Dear friends

This time of year can seem pretty dismal, with dark evenings and murky mornings, and spring still some way off. But the days are lengthening, and there are signs around us in February of the new life to come in the world around us. Snowdrops were always one of my dad's favourites – tiny, nodding flowers that really reward a closer look than the cursory glance we might give them!

And in February we mark the beginning of Lent, on Ash Wednesday, 14 February this year. Lent lasts for 40 days – not including Sundays – to remind Christians of the time Jesus spent in the wilderness being tested by Satan at the beginning of his ministry.

On Ash Wednesday, there is the opportunity to be marked with the sign of the cross, in ash made from last year's palm crosses, on the forehead. This is a sign of penitence, of facing up to and seeking forgiveness for those things which are wrong in our lives, as we look to set these things aside and live more as God calls us to. There are those who see this as something negative, as contrary to seeking to live our lives in a positive way. However, I believe that facing up to our failings – and let's face it, we all have those! – with honesty and self-awareness, is the first step to moving on, rather than being tempted to wallow in guilt and self-defeat.

Freedom to become ever more the people God created us to be is a glorious freedom. I wouldn't claim that any of us get there in our lifetimes, but surely seeking to be more loving and Christ-like in our daily lives is a recipe for a better way of living. And by Christ-like I don't mean the awful Victorian image of 'gentle Jesus meek and mild'! This is the Jesus who was courageous, always ready to confront hypocrisy and injustice, who spoke up for those who couldn't speak for themselves, whose love for his Father and obedience to his will was complete. His closest friends – both male and female – were mostly ordinary working people, alongside those on the fringes of society who were rejected by the religious establishment. He clearly believed that all people were loved and valued by God and he lived that belief.

Ultimately of course he paid the price, and was betrayed, tortured and put to death in the most humiliating and painful way. But that series of brutal acts couldn't defeat God's love, and on the third day after his death Jesus was alive. He continued to appear to his disciples for several weeks, until his ascension to heaven and the coming of the Holy Spirit, which turned his ragtag bunch of followers into a body of women and men who went on to spread his message and share his love.

So that's why we need to psychologically 'clear the decks' at the start of Lent, so we can spend time focussing on how we should be living out that call, and expressing that transformative love, in a world facing conflict, the climate crisis, environmental breakdown and injustice, alongside the personal burdens we all carry, which are part of human experience. And we can do it with real, deep joy in our hearts, knowing that nothing can defeat God's love, that we are never alone, and that whatever our struggles, Jesus is there beside us.

This Lent I intend to be enjoying the small beauties – like the snowdrops – looking for the light in the darkness and celebrating God's love.

LOWER HALSTOW PARISH COUNCIL

From Lower Halstow's Flood Warden

I would like to ask that all landowners within Lower Halstow, check that their land drains are excavated, enabling surface land water to flow to the estuary twice a day without hindrance. There are many sluice gates on landowners land, therefore, please can you check that they are all working properly, again helping the surface water to drain out to the estuary twice a day. The weather, as we are told, is getting warmer and wetter, and the surface water at present is causing concern, therefore, if everyone has assisted, by clearing all gullies and checking sluice gates, we are doing our level best to avoid flooding within the Village. Again to assist Lower Halstow Village if there are any blocked drains, to contact the Parish Clerk and I will attempt to have them cleared asap. We have at present an ongoing request with KCC, as a drain. that is very near a right of way, to be assessed, as the actual path itself may be the cause of the very blocked drain.
