# Site 3c: Old Allotment Site, Little England

# SITE DESCRIPTION

Flat site, currently used for grazing horses. Much of the site is prone to flooding (limiting potential development to eastern edge).

Adjoins river (to west) and residential (to north, east and south)

### **PROPOSED USE**

Housing (part)

## **ACCESS**

No existing vehicular access, but adjoins Little England. Public footpath runs along eastern boundary of

DCC comments: Should be able to form adequate sight lines (2.4m by 43.0m) as on outside of bend.

# **ENVIRONMENT AND LOCAL FEATURES**

Within Conservation Area

Adjoins Grade II Listed Building (Little England Cottage)

Site is closely associated with the open land and Manor House and river to the west, with an intimate character.

Stream likely to provide wildlife interest

Hedgerows along main site boundaries, and ash trees (corner locations)

#### **OTHER**

Large part of site is within flood plain, limiting the potential development area to the easternmost edge adjoining the footpath

### **OVERALL**
