## Highways

A formal consultation is underway regarding a proposed signalised pedestrian crossing on the A329 in Cholsey, approximately 30 metres north of the Ferry Lane/Papist Way junction. If you wish to comment, the consultation closes at 5pm on Friday, 13th March 2026. Details can be found online by searching for the consultation.

The Council need 9 to 12 volunteers to make a speed watch program in Moulsoford viable. ## Green Spaces

**Playground** - The spring safety inspection has been arranged and is expected to take place before Easter.

**Recreation Ground** - The trees lining the Pavillion drive have been pruned to allow clearance for high sided vans. Elsewhere, some overhanging branches have been cut back where they were blocking the path near the wildflower meadow, and separately near the path behind the picnic table area. The acacia tree has also been pruned to keep it under control.

**Basketball Court** - The Council is waiting for the annual playground inspection report before planning when to refurbish the surface, but we are currently looking at next financial year. Meantime we are exploring options for possible improvements to the basketball equipment that might be included in the refurbishment project.

## Pavilion Management

**Pavilion Roof** - A full structural survey is being arranged following recent water ingress. Once completed, the Council will explore options for installing solar panels to help reduce running costs.

## Garden Waste Collection

Residents who receive garden waste collections in South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse are being reminded to buy a new permit if they wish to continue receiving collections from 1st April through to 31st March 2027. South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils introduced the garden waste permit scheme in spring 2025. Garden waste permits expire on 31st March each year and residents must buy a new one annually to keep receiving the service. 
## Free Compost Collection - Saturday, 7th March, 9am–11am



When the GWR track was built through Berkshire and Brunel's bridge built across the Thames, a station was erected and opened as Wallingford Road in 1840. In 1866 the station was renamed Moulsford but closed in 1892, being replaced with the current Cholsey station. Until the 1950's this was called Cholsey and Moulsford Station.



The Moulsford station was at Waterloo Close, a cul-de-sac near the A329 railway overpass bridge into Cholsey. Next to the station was a hotel/tavern called The Railway Tavern, later renamed The Gables, built in 1841 possibly by Brunel, also Grade II listed. The original station was a simple shelter. On the Moulsford side of the tracks a waiting room was built.



Near the station on the Reading Road another inn was built in the mid-19th century known as the Waterloo Inn, Grade II listed; was then converted into a nursery named Railway Children and is now called 'Little Willows', operated from 2013 by Cranford School.

The Moulsford Asylum opened in September 1870, named for the nearest railway station, which was then Moulsford. It underwent several name changes until it became the Fair Mile Hospital. An excellent source of information is Ian Wheeler's book 'Fair Mile Hospital'.



Several accidents were recorded at or near Moulsford Station, including train crashes and fatalities. Much of the local railway history, together with other bits of historic interest, can be read in Dr. Barrie Charles' book 'Crime and Calamity in Cholsey'. The author is a resident of Cholsey and has written several books about the area.


Thank you to Janet, Gary and Trevor for running the Coffee Shop in February and to all of you who came along.
