

# History of the Hill & Valley area in Ten Objects

# 4 - St Mary Bourne, old Vicarage wall



This roadside section of the brick and flint wall shows two phases in what was then the entrance to the courtyard (the present drive-way is 'new'). The first opening was wider, marked by the brick piers on left and right: wide enough for a pony and trap, perhaps, closed by wicket gates. The middle brick pier shows that the width of the entrance was later reduced by over a third, from the right. The flint-work of this small section is skilled and runs in courses, so likely 19th century, whereas the final section, which closed the entrance, is of coarser work and so probably inserted at the same time as the present drive was made.

Why make an entrance narrower? Only to stop a large crowd entering. Might that have been done in nervous reaction to the reportedly 200 rioters forcing their way into the Vicarage early on Monday, 22 November 1830, in the 'Swing' protest against the vicar, William Easton? Perhaps...

We have a confirmation in early June. If anyone is interested in being confirmed, do please get in touch and we can chat about it. It's May! And you can almost see your crops growing this month. There are so many salads and veg to sow now and many of the seeds will germinate in a few days. Sow courgettes, marrows, cucumbers and squashes in small pots on a sunny windowsill.

Towards the end of May, when temperatures are warmer at night, sow tender, sun loving crops outside, such as runner beans, French beans and sweetcorn. If you prefer to buy young veg plants from the Garden Centre make sure you harden off the plants before they are planted in the ground. **Hurstbourne Priors May Fair** on **5**<sup>th</sup> **May** can be another good source of plants and seedlings. Get your tomatoes into their final pots or grow bags. They can go outside this month once the risks of frosts are over. Now temperatures are rising, controlling slugs and slug damage becomes a challenge.

Beer traps and Nematodes are some of the most effective methods - whichever you use, check daily. Plant out Sweet Peas, sprinkle fertiliser around the base of hedges and shrubs. Support tall perennials - if you do it now plants will grow up and through them hiding supports from view. Split congested clumps of perennials and pot up - also pot up any seedlings that have sprouted. Any spares would be gratefully received by the Flower Show Plant stall. Plant up tubs and hanging baskets with bedding plants - keep protected from frosts. Don't forget to water and mound up the soil around your seed potatoes and repair any bald patches in your lawn. There is a lot to do in the garden this month!

Meanwhile preparations continue for this year's **Flower Show** on **Saturday 26<sup>th</sup> July**. We would be very grateful

for any volunteers to help set up on the day, run stalls or dismantle the Showground.

Please contact **smbflowershowandfete@gmail.com** if you can spare a few hours to help. We would also be keen to hear from anyone interested in joining the committee. We meet monthly and are a friendly bunch, so please get in touch if you would like to get involved.

Please remember us when clearing out your wardrobe, spring cleaning or dividing up your plants. The Vintage Clothing, Bric A Brac, Plate smashing, Book and Plant stalls are a much-loved part of the Flower Show and would all welcome your donations. Last year proceeds from these stalls alone raised over £2,000 - all of which goes to village charities.

# **Parish Council Activities**

The Parish Council met for its monthly meeting on Tuesday April 8<sup>th</sup> and after the resignation of Bridget Culley in January three candidates had put their

names forward for possible co-option to replace her.

Each was given an opportunity to speak to members after which Robbie Henderson was chosen and in joining the council will follow in family footsteps!

**Southern Water** in conjunction with the Flood and Emergency Group held an open meeting on 31<sup>st</sup> March which was very well attended by over 90 parishioners and other valley residents. They explained the work that has been completed over the past twelve months, and what remains to be done (primarily between the church and Applegate). This will need a road closure but will be clearly and explicitly signed, unlike much of the recent closures and diversions. A copy of the **Southern Water presentation** is now available on the PC website. https://www.stmarybourne-pc.gov.uk/community/stmary-bourne-parish-council-12760/flood-information/.

Southern Water have also made a significant contribution to the funding for the Play Area Project and together with other recent grants and donations this has brought the target within close reach and the relevant planning applications are now in train.

A **new flagpole** has been installed to replace its tired predecessor on the Recreation Ground: look out for different flags flying at appropriate times of the year in future! (*See next column*).

The **Annual Parish Assembly** will be held in the Village Centre on **Tuesday May 6**<sup>th</sup>. Parishioners are all welcome and encouraged to attend. There will be a banner on the bridge and leaflets about it are enclosed with this edition of Hill & Valley (St Mary Bourne only.)





# **Postcard from Binland**

Our new neighbours, Reg and Carol are an adulterous, noisy pair. They moved in about a month ago and have started carrying out alterations and general building work at all times of the day, often before the acceptable 8.00am watershed. But then I should mention that they are rooks and not people. Their home is the very top of a large ash tree in my garden, some 50 yards from the established rookery in the park. - Go wild with your lawn: Let the grass grow long, skip the chemicals, and plant wildflowers to create a bug buffet.
- A cheeky dip: Build a wildlife pond for year-round water and insects, but don't forget a safe exit, like a log ramp, for any hogs who fall in.

A euphony of sound - Should you find yourself awake in the night just as the light is starting to arrive in the sky, try opening your window, or even a door to the outside, and take a listen to the wonderful chorus outside. The dawn chorus is a symphony of birdsong that occurs at dawn, primarily during the spring breeding season. It's a time when many male birds sing to attract mates and establish territories and can be heard from the earliest signs of daylight until the sun fully rises. Birds like robins, blackbirds, and thrushes are among the first to sing, often starting even before sunrise, with other species joining in as the day progresses. It will only be happening for a couple more weeks, and if you miss it you will have to wait until next year.

# Remembering...

Pauline Mary Wood 12th May 1935 - 21st February 2025

Pauline was born on the 12th May 1935 in Sutton Coldfield in the West Midlands. She was the third daughter of Arthur & Phyllis Guise and had two older sisters, Diana and Norma. In spite of the war years and subsequent rationing, she spent a happy energetic childhood, and she made many lifelong friends. After schooling, she moved to London to work in the Ministry of Agriculture.

Pauline loved London life. She thoroughly enjoyed sharing flats with friends and taking part in whatever fun was going on. She joined tennis and squash clubs, loved dancing, and it was at a sailing club event in 1958 that she met Gerry Wood. The couple were married on 1st June 1962 in Lymynge Church in Kent where her parents were then living.

This was the start of a 63-year partnership and a loving relationship with Stoke and Winterbourne Cottage, which Gerry & Pauline bought and renovated in 1962 with the help of friends. They also bought a small parcel

of land nearby where they built calf pens and fattened calves and piglets for market. At this time, Pauline was working as a farm secretary/bookkeeper and Gerry was in practice as a chartered quantity surveyor. Their daughter Penny was born in Winterbourne Cottage in 1967, and it became a wonderful place for family and



friends to visit and enjoy all the outdoor activities on offer and Pauline's excellent cooking.

In 1972 Gerry & Pauline bought a holiday cottage in Co Kerry, Ireland - another ruin that needed total renovation - which gave full scope to Pauline's energies and administrative skills. They had the cottage for 50 years and it provided magical wild memories for many friends and family members. In the same year (1972) they also bought the neighbouring property to Winterbourne Cottage, Bourne Cottage, which they renovated in six months so that Pauline's widowed mother, Phyllis, could move to live near them.

The Woods always had pets and animals to look after dogs, ponies and young farm livestock. Many Stoke residents will have memories of Gerry driving a governess cart around the lanes of Stoke and of Pauline walking the same lanes, always with a dog at her heel. Pauline liked to be outside & busy. She enjoyed helping Penny with her gardening business in addition to the maintenance of her own garden and 22 acres of land

which they inherited from Rebecca Pentland in 1990 where they planted some woodland - Pentland Wood - which will be a legacy to them all. After Gerry's death in 2009, Pauline continued to work hard on the land with the help of Ed Pockett. They did many projects together for almost 15 years: fencing, clearing, logging & repairing. Her energy seemed indefatigable.

Pauline loved her life in Stoke and being involved in Stoke Village Fund fêtes and street parties. She was always up for being involved and was a wonderful neighbour.

In 1996 she took up bell ringing in St Peter's church which she continued until her loss of hearing made it too difficult. On hearing of her death, the bell ringing team rang a quarter peal in tribute to her; and one ringer wrote: "...she was such a courageous and loving person ...we've lost a great friend and councillor but are incredibly lucky to have known her".

Pauline was a loyal, kind, hardworking, cheerful and energetic lady who was also incredibly strong, mentally and physically. The centre of her world was always her beloved family, especially Penny - her greatest joy and companion - and Winterbourne Cottage where she breathed her last in a place which she dearly loved. Though she will be deeply missed, she will always live in our hearts.

# Jeffrey Graham Hardy Harrison 20<sup>th</sup> June 1943 – 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2025

(Compiled from tributes given in St Peter's Church, St Mary Bourne on 27th March)

Jeff was the youngest child of James and Joan Harrison. He had one sister Penny who was 4 years older than him.

He was born in Hull in 1943 during a wartime air raid which may perhaps have had an influence on his future character because Jeff was never afraid of danger, and he always loved an adventure. There were hair-raising driving escapades and capsized sailing incidents when he was a teenager; and for his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday celebration he chose to go Wing Walking on a biplane. Jeff did his best to get as much as possible out of life and at the same time give great enjoyment to others.

After schooling at Hymers College in Hull, he trained as an accountant and then moved to London where he met and married Jenny in 1976. Their children Abbie and Michael were born in 1978 and 1981, and they started their family life living in Reigate, Surrey. But Jeff never abandoned his Northern roots - he kept his accent and supported Hull Football Club all his life.

In 1979 Jeff joined Peter Michael's Microconsultants Company. When he was subsequently promoted to Finance Director, he was required to be based in their Head Office in West Mills, Newbury, so the Harrison family moved from Reigate to Binley in April 1985.

They bought Great Eastwards and lived there happily for seventeen years while Jeff pursued a long battle with planners to let them build the family home they had always dreamt of. When Jeff eventually achieved victory and whilst their new house was being built, they moved to Little Brook House in St Mary Bourne. During that time, many convivial gatherings were enjoyed with local friends at The George Inn and at home.

Jeff was a very astute and skilful businessman, and he was also a man with many other interests. He loved cars and owned a vintage Bentley called Betty which he took to Le Mans and went to Goodwood Revival meetings. Having been an intrepid sailor in his teenage years in Hull, he later shared a 42 ft boat in the Solent on which he regularly went to sea. Amongst his other hobbies were property development, astronomy, collecting antique clocks & funny hats, and telling excruciating jokes.

Jeff loved fun and entertaining. For many years he and Jenny hosted wonderful firework parties at Great Eastwards. There were also croquet & snooker parties lasting late into the night, an annual clay shoot in support of the Conservatives, and many other local fundraising events and occasions at which Jeff was always a very generous supporter and host.

Primarily though, Jeff was a devoted family man. Jenny was the centre of his existence for over 50 years and when Abbie and Michael were growing up, he would

arrange his work commitments so that whenever possible he could drive them to school in order to participate in their lives and interests. He was enormously proud of all his family and the arrival of his grandchildren Freddie & Edward, William & Alex brought him enormous joy and continued pleasure.



Sadly, in recent years, Jeff suffered increasingly from poor health. But in December last year, he and Jenny were still able to celebrate their traditional Boxing Day lunch with family and close friends. It was another memorable party at Great Eastwards which everyone enjoyed with Jeff in very good spirits.

Jeff leaves behind a lot of good memories of a very warm-hearted man. Many people benefitted from his kindness and generosity during his lifetime and he is sadly missed. R.I.P.

# RESILIENCE PLAN – LONGPARISH If there is a Risk to life always call 999 first.

Villages and Towns are being encouraged to develop a Resilience Plan in case of events that cause major disruption in the village. While the risks are hopefully few and far between, the obvious ones are extreme weather events leading to loss of power and possible flooding, fire and major accidents.

The Resilience Plan has been initiated by the Parish Council but anyone from the Community who would like to be part of an initial response team, even to lead it, to be first branch of the Communication tree, be a first aider, or volunteer in any other way please contact the Parish Clerk email clerk@longparish.org.uk.

### **REST CENTRE**

We are lucky enough to have a few places which could act as a rest centre in an Emergency, the Village Hall and the Plough being the first options. This is not just for residents but also for somewhere Emergency Services can use in the event of a fire or accident.

The generators, purchased using a grant from SSE, are now installed at the Plough- which means there is now a facility for providing power for essentials such as a warm space, charging phones, hot food and drinks in an extended power cut. Details of how and in what circumstances this will operate, are being drawn up and will be put on the Village website.

The priority now is to develop a Communication Tree via WhatsApp Groups. If an event is likely to cause major disruption to the village, information can be cascaded down easily and quickly. Some areas of the village already have their own WhatsApp group e.g. Forton, North Acre. Any admins of area groups already established, please contact us about joining the Resilience WhatsApp Group so that information can be relayed directly to every area in an emergency and support offered to those who need it.

If you would like to set up a WhatsApp group for your immediate area, please let us know the first person to contact. It would be great to have the whole village covered. Not everyone uses WhatsApp but as long as some of your neighbours do, then information can be passed on in person, keeping people informed of what's going on.

# Things you can do

- Set up or Join a Resilience WhatsApp group for your area.
- Keep your trees and hedges well maintained near power lines and roads.
- Keep any drains on your land clear.
- Work out your own Emergency plan and list of useful telephone numbers
- Most importantly sign up to the Priority Lists, if you are eligible, for Water and Power, particularly if you use medical equipment that relies on power.

# LONGPARISH WILDLIFE FERAL PIGEONS



We seem to have a small flock of them in North Acre. The Pigeons we most often see today are a descendant of the Rock Dove. Humans first domesticated this breed over 5,000 years ago. They were originally bred for food and trained to carry messages during the war. These Feral Pigeons are now back in the wild and live alongside us especially in our towns and cities. In some cities they have become a pest leaving their droppings everywhere. I think towns and cities encourage Peregrine Falcons to nest on cathedrals and churches as their most popular food is Feral Pigeons.

Racing pigeons is quite a popular sport, they are taken to a location somewhere in the UK and released often in their hundreds, then when they arrive back at their loft the time and distance is recorded to see who won. Champion pigeons can sell for a lot of money.

Pigeons usually breed in Spring and Summer, but ferals can have up to six broods a year. Their nests are made from odd twigs and leaves. They nest anywhere from open ledged to holes in buildings or even on cliffs. Once the nest has been made the female will wait a couple of days before laying the first egg. The second will come in 24-48 hours, usually a total of two eggs are laid, incubated for around 18 days and fledges in 28-30 days. Pigeons and Doves feed their young on what's called Pigeon's milk which is regurgitated from its crop by the parent. They will eat almost anything from seeds, buds on trees, berries and human scraps of food.




