# Buildwas Parish Council COUNCIL MEETING

### On Monday 4th September 2017

at 7.45pm in Buildwas Village Hall

#### **MINUTES**

Present: Cllr. C. Meads (Chairman), J. Grainger, J. Heath, L. Pratt, S Ratcliffe

#### 1) Apologies for Absence

Received from Cllr. Wilcox.

#### 2) Declarations of Disclosable Interests & Dispensation Requests

Councillor Heath declared a pecuniary interest in planning application 17/01867/FUL.

#### 3) Public Session

The agent spoke in relation to an informal enquiry regarding potential residential development at the site of the former settling tanks. She was seeking initial views of the parish council prior to commencing an application process, timescale for which would be late 2017/early 2018. She explained that the site is classed as brownfield as it was previously used for settling tanks. In response to a query, she clarified that the site is to the left of the dam and that there will be no effect on the dam. The council emphasised that this is important as the dam pays a crucial structural role. The agent stated that appropriate technical surveys will be submitted with any planning application. The architects had drawn illustrative plans showing potential for circa 5 dwellings and demonstrating how design cues from the local vernacular in the village could be incorporated into a scheme of development. The site is approximately 7 metres above the road which would provide access to the site and there is an existing embankment in place which will provide some screening. The council highlighted potential impact on the landscape and the agent said that extra planting could be done. In response to a question from a councillor, the agent stated that an ecology survey would be carried out and that protection and enhancement measures could be considered.

The chairman of the council stated that Buildwas is a community cluster which has potential for circa 10 dwellings in the form of infill to 2026. The target of 10 dwellings to 2026 has already been significantly exceeded. The agent highlighted that the site is brownfield and that Shropshire Council's Local Plan is currently under review. She asked

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what infrastructure the council is seeking in the parish. She said that the application would attract CIL funding and the dwellings would be likely to be over 100m<sup>2</sup> in size. The clerk stated that the parish has some priorities outlined in the Place Plan but that this would need to be updated as it is not been reviewed for a couple of years.

It was **RESOLVED** to adopt the minutes.

#### 5) Matters arising from the minutes

Cllr. Meads reported that it has been confirmed that inspection regimes at the former ash landfill site are continuing.

Cllr. Wild reported that Shropshire Council is currently consulting on a Libraries Strategy and Parking Strategy.

#### b) Planning applications for comment

(i) 17/01867/FUL - Former Post Office, Park View, Buildwas, Telford, Shropshire, TF8 7BY
 - Erection of building with A1 Class business at ground floor with 1No dwelling at first floor

<u>RESOLVED</u> to object to the revised application as the proposed business use has changed from A1 to A2. The Parish Council supported the previous application because a shop would have been of benefit to the community but class A2 is professional services, not a shop. The Parish Council was also not convinced of the need for the residential element.

#### a) Updates on matters previously reported

(i) Buildwas Village Hall project

Councillor Grainger reported that pre-application advice has been requested and feedback is awaited from the case officer.

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#### (ii) Ironbridge Power Station

The agents acting on behalf of Uniper had been in contact. There was little to report at present but they promised to communicate with the parish council once things progress further.

#### (iii) Speed reduction scheme

Richard Ayton of Shropshire Council had provided initial feedback on the council's comments on the scheme. He was of the opinion that an extension of the 30 mph limit could be problematic as the police would be unlikely to agree to this. He was however awaiting feedback from the consultants, WSP, who had drawn up the plans.

#### (iv) Streetlights

The clerk had asked Npower to update the schedule of lights to reflect the fact that LEDs have now been installed.
