Row the Pacific



ou might recall that back in April 2023 we covered the challenge facing 4 rowers embarking on a 2,800 mile journey across the Pacific Ocean, all in aid of the charity MIND.

This inaugural 'World's Toughest Row' began on 12 June 2023 with 14 teams participating from around the world. 'Pacific Discovery' set off from the historic harbour of Monterey, followed the path of many adventurers and explorers of yesteryear, and rowed the whole 2,800 miles to the finish line in

Hanalei Bay on the stunning island of Kauai. A hard-to-beat backdrop for what is the most incredible, once-in-alifetime adventure.

The team spent two years, almost every day, preparing themselves - mentally and physically - for this monumental feat. They trained, ate, slept, and repeated - rowing, getting to know each other, and pouring over tasks in their master plan spreadsheet!

They rowed non-stop for 34 days: 2 hours on the oars and 2 hours off.
They consumed 850,000 calories and experienced equipment failures, tough weather patterns and the perils of almost capsizing; but had a front seat with a 360' view of 34 sunrises, sunsets and moonbows. An experience that will last them a lifetime.

A view from across the pond

n April, I will "officially" become a member of the Federated Women's Institutes of Ontario. The WI movement was co-founded in 1897 by Canadian, Adelaide Hunter Hoodless (Feb. 27, 1858 - Feb. 26, 1910). About 40km from Waterloo, is her homestead in St. George (National Historic Site/museum).

Born in Ontario, Madge Watt immigrated to England in 1913. She introduced the concepts and practices of Canada's WI movement. WI's U.K. inaugural meeting was held on September 16, 1915, in Llanfairpwll, Wales.

WI began in rural areas with its cornerstone directive to teach 'domestic science' and its importance. Along with WI, Adelaide's tireless campaign for proper household management resulted in this topic added to schools' curriculum. Her commitment and perseverance are extraordinary standards to uphold. WI's 'resolutions' are a testament of results from decades of challenging and influencing attitudes, laws, ideals and definitions throughout society. Canadian 'resolutions' are posted on WI's national website.

On February 8th, I was warmly welcomed at the Bloomingdale (Ontario) Branch's 75th Anniversary celebration. For the occasion, everyone was asked to bring a tea cup/saucer (most of which were made in the U.K.) to briefly tell its story and what WI membership has meant. "Where do I start with decades of cherished memories?" one member exclaimed and others shared wonderful, heartfelt reminiscences about mothers and sisters as WI and 4-H leaders.

Wi's beloved and valued 'sisterhood' carries on making connections in all corners of Canada, especially illuminating pathways for women. With dedication and leadership, this women's organisation continues to strive for the betterment of society around the world -adding to WI's legacy. Adelaide would be proud!



enham Community Centre is celebrating its 20th Anniversary so we are holding a celebratory evening with the return of the very popular lan Gallagher who will swing us through the event with Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Matt Munro, Sammy Davis Junior and Michael Bublé.

We are aware that times are difficult with the high cost of living so have kept the price as low as we can at £14 per ticket. Do please bring your own drinks and nibbles. A Potted History

The village had outgrown the Old Lenham Parish Hall and whatever renovations we did to the amenities such as the kitchen, toilets and heating they were never going to be adequate - plus it wasn't large enough.

So, the seed was sown to build a new community centre within walking distance of the village.

First, we had to find the land, which was quite a hurdle, and then of course purchase it. As you will probably all know our community centre was built on land off the Old Ashford Road along with the "new" GP

surgery and low-cost housing; the road was named Groom Way.

Fund-raising started in earnest and we then put in applications for Lottery and other funding; twice we were turned down by the Lottery but thankfully, after hiring Tom Roberts at a cost of £10,000, our third application was successful.

Outline planning permission was applied for and granted in 1999; full planning permission granted in 2002 and building started later that year. The keys were officially handed over from the builders in January 2004.

Some of the original Management Committee are still on board; Nick Osborne, Ian George and me, Julia Allen. Some are no longer with us; Harry Appleton, Tony Robinson and our Secretary Margaret Mitchell. Roy Gill and Nigel Watson have both moved away from the village. But most importantly without the tenacity and determination from Nick Osborne (Chairman) it would never have happened, so thank you Nick.

We would also like to thank the Parish Council and many others who helped us along the way. Sorry, we can't name you all here.



A Story about 'Puritan Troublemakers and President F.D Roosevelt' (part 2)

n the last *Focus*, we heard about Thomas and Helchea Reader, the 'troublesome' sons of the wealthy yeoman Paul Reader. He died in 1597 and left his estate to his wife and subsequently, once the children came of age, to Patience (1578 – ?) Thomas (1580 - 1632), Helchea (1583 - 1637), Sara (1585 - 1616), Margaret (1588

- 1610) and Mary (1593 - ?).

Each of the girls were to inherit £40, which was a small fortune then; Thomas would inherit the Hall House and land in Lenham; and Helchea a house in Boughton Aluph. The hall was in the centre, with the parlour on one side and the buttery and the pantry on the other. Above the parlour and, at the 'lower end' (the buttery and pantry), were two chambers. There were also outbuildings; a bread house, a milk house, a kitchen, barn and barnyard. It is likely that the floor of the house was clay.

The archive holds a document from 1594 in which two men were accused of entering Paul Reader's property and taking up the clay floor. Theft of building materials seems to have a long tradition! However, the hall was a rather prestigious place, with even a painted cloth as a wall hanging.

It contained a cupboard, a long table, two benches, four chairs, five joined stools and twelve cushions. The parlour, which was part of the family's private quarters, was similarly furnished but without wallhangings.




A "joined" stool gets its name from the fact that proper "joints" were used in making the stool. (image: W&A)

The chambers upstairs had comfortable beds, with feather bedding and bolsters. One of the beds had a trundle bed (a bed under the bed) which traditionally was used for a servant to attend to the master in the night when needed. The family had 23 sheets, ten tablecloths and 30 table napkins, which are all indicators of a very comfortable lifestyle. On the farm were three cows, thirteen ewes, a ram, four lambs, six hens and four chickens. At the time when the inventory was taken, wheat was growing on nine acres.

The Reader family owned goods to the value of £222.

According to information in the book by Michael Zell "Industry in the Countryside", the Reader family was in the top 10% of society in terms of the value of their household goods. However, by 1664 there was only one person with the surname Reader living in Lenham and she was too poor to have to pay Hearth Tax. So what happened? (More in the next *Focus*).



New fastest-growing sport from USA - Swat-Ball

traight from Florida, a mix of fly-swatting and darts, comes the latest craze sweeping the States and on its way here. Invented as recently as very early April last year, the game involves hitting ('swatting') jelly-balls with the fly-swat paddle onto an enlarged darts board. The jelly bursts on impact and the score is recorded from the jelly-mark left behind. First to 180 wins. A specially designed clean-up device ('J-ball cloth') is used to wipe the board ready for the next swat. Head of Swat-Ball USA says: 'It's a great way of releasing anger without damaging your health - any fool can do it'.

Here in the UK, there's talk of a Swat-Ball organisation ('ASBO'). Watch out for details.



Parish Council news from Cllr. John Britt

You will see regular updates on all the parish council's activities in the *Focus*, our website and social media.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Every year Lenham Parish Council organises an Annual Parish Meeting. This is not the usual parish council meeting, which deals specifically with the "business" of the village, it is more an opportunity to hear what many of the groups in the village are doing, to catch up with them and update on what is happening around us in general.

This year that event will take place on Friday 19 April at the Lenham Community Centre. The doors will open at 7pm and the meeting will start at 7:30pm. Local groups will be present with information about their services and opportunities for activities.

There will be an opportunity to ask questions of all the parish councillors in an informal setting and to share your views on what you would like to see the parish council focus on, if you feel there is something which needs addressing. We also hope to be in a position to discuss the outcome of the recent review of the Maidstone Local Plan.

Unlike our usual meetings there will also be refreshments! We don't have those at our monthly gatherings but for the Annual Parish Meeting we do. So why not come along, and let us know what your concerns are and tell us where you think we are doing OK?

BUILDING WORKS, OLD HAM LANE ROAD CLOSURE – MARCH TO JULY

The company working on behalf of Countryside Homes, the building company developing the 136 new homes off Old Ham Lane (strategic site 5 in the Lenham Neighbourhood Plan), will begin work during the last week of March.

This means Old Ham Lane will be closed to all traffic at the junction with Ham Lane, from 25 March until around 22 July to allow the road to be widened and services laid.

Access to William Pit Field will be maintained during this time. Access to the properties at the top end of Old Ham Lane will be via the junction with Sandway Road.

It may be possible to allow access through Old Ham Lane during this period if the works reach a point where the road surface can be reinstated. This will entirely depend on progress and cannot be guaranteed.

Once the works are complete there will be a revised and wider access to the development site west of Old Ham Lane and a new, temporary junction to this road just north of the railway bridge.

Recipe of the Month Mrs Sutherland's Devonshire Apple Cake

Ingredients:

170 g (6oz) self-raising flour

85g (3oz) unsalted butter

85g (3oz) caster sugar

1 ½ pudding basinful of chopped apple – small pieces

1 egg, beaten

Method:

Preheat the oven to 190C/375F/Gas 5 and butter a shallow baking tin.

Sift the flour into a basin and rub in the butter, then add the sugar. Stir in the chopped apple and finally the beaten egg. The mixture should be fairly stiff.

Place in a shallow baking tin, sprinkle the top with caster sugar and bake for about



¾ hour. Remove from the oven and let it cool slightly. If desired, dust with icing sugar before serving.

This is a lovely pudding for a Sunday lunch, served with cream or ice cream. If using as a cake, then allow to cool before cutting. It should keep for several days in an airtight tin.



Book Review


From the Lenham Library

he author I am showcasing this month is Susan Cooper. She's an awardwinning writer recognised by the American Library Association for her contribution to teen fiction. Her books mix fantasy and fiction, often incorporating the supernatural.

The author moved from Britain to the USA and settled in the Marshfield area of Massachusetts.

It was here that her book Ghost Hawk was researched and written. It tells the story of the short life and coming of age of a young member of the Wampanoag tribe. In the middle of Winter Little Hawk is sent out into the wilderness where he will spend three months entirely alone. He can take only a bow and a quiver full of arrows and his mystical tomahawk. His father has given him a metal knife, traded with furs, from the white settlers across the great sea.

If the young boy survives three moons by himself, he will be a man. When Little Hawk returns to his village, he finds it decimated by death and disease brought by the people of the new Plymouth Colony.



This is a beautifully written book describing the relationship between the native people and the land; and the respect for nature and its bounty. It's a story of suffering and survival and the close friendship of an English boy and an Indian. It is a portrait of life in 17th century colonial America where religious bigotry and intolerance were rife and interactions with the native population led to acts of betrayal in the acquisition of

land. The book has a twist in the middle which I was not expecting but it only encouraged me to read on.

The author has been praised for her contribution to children's fiction. Teenagers place a lot of value on relationships, culture and the environment and understanding the genres that appeal to teens is critical to engage them when their lives are increasingly digital and when reading has to compete with games and social media.

y the time you are reading this we will be half way through spring and hopefully it has stopped raining every day! Along with all the other joys of spring, this is the time when hedgehogs start to emerge from hibernation, although being nocturnal they are not always easy to spot. Lots of information can be found online with www.britishhedgehogs.org.uk being a great source.

You can help them by leaving out water and food which will help supplement their diet of beetles, slugs, caterpillars etc. One of the best things we can do is to hedgehog-proof our gardens and open spaces, leaving areas 'wild' or untidy, creating gaps in fencing (they can cover large distances on their night-time wanders) and reducing other obstacles.

We are fortunate in Lenham to have Kevin, who has been rescuing hedgehogs for several years, nursing them back to health until they are able to be released. He liaises with Medway Hedgehog Rescue and the British Hedgehog Preservation Society but funds the cost for food and medication himself. If you find an injured hedgehog, would like to help Kevin or donate food or newspapers, then please contact him on 07932 383552.

Simple Well-being. Our Roots

e live under constant influence from external and internal factors, and some of those influencing forces can/do become our roots. 

way of life we inherit from different places help us to adapt to life in the area we live in. The deeper our roots and the bigger our "rooting ground" the more will we flourish.


Roots ensure growth. Strong, healthy roots ensure continuous development, which will bring more satisfaction and happiness to our lives.

Deep roots ensure our resilience in the face of challenging circumstances. They become the foundation for self-discovery. This is an aspect where we differ from trees. A tree is a tree. Oak cannot change into Maple over time. But a person born in a traditional, multigenerational manual worker family can become a composer. But that will happen not "despite" the roots, but because of them. Deep roots reduce confusion, which helps to focus the mind and supports self-discovery. And one more thing — If our roots are strong and deep, even if we fall, we can still be able to grow in the right direction.

So, what are your roots? How strong are they? May you need to consider repotting? Until the next time....





NATO was established to create a force to counter Soviet armies stationed in central and eastern Europe after World War II. The current member states of NATO are Albania, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Montenegro, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey, UK and USA.

NATO is a military organisation, which consists of a complete system of commands for possible wartime use.

It has a Military Committee, with representatives of the military chiefs of staff of the member states. Funding generally is not used for the procurement of military equipment, which is provided by the member states – though the NATO airborne Early Warning Force, a fleet of radar-bearing aircraft designed to protect against a surprise low-flying attack, was funded jointly.

eed them and they will come (and maybe bring their babies with them).

As we enter into spring, the birds will be singing up a storm and the dawn chorus is truly a beautiful sound. Take some time to get an early morning walk and just drink in those wonderful melodies as they call out to each other to either establish their territories or search for a mate

Once they've made their choices and then started nesting, birds will be needing a lot more in the way of food. Not only to help the female to prepare for laying and then looking after their young but to feed the young birds themselves. If you want to install a feeder of some description make sure that it is in a place where the birds will feel safe and secure; this means not too close to any bushes or trees (a few yards away so they can see any threat or flee if needed). If you've never put out any food before, things like sunflower seed hearts, split peanuts and even bits of apple will be welcome. You may eventually get some uncommon visitors like those pictured.





The Common Redpoll


This little bird is easily mistaken for perhaps a sparrow or dunnock from the back but once it turns around that very distinctive red patch on its head gives it away. Whilst the name implies it's common, that's more to distinguish it from the lesser redpoll. They love sunflower hearts.

The Greenfinch

The Greenfinch was once a more common bird but alas several years ago they were struck down by a virus that ran through the population. They also love sunflower hearts and the male is very green with a brighter green stripe on







The Goldcrest

The Goldcrest is a very elusive visitor and will more likely be seen on the outskirts of a village near wooded areas. They will eat some small seeds but you will more likely see them flitting through trees picking off morels from the branches and twigs. Britain's smallest bird weighs as much as a 20p piece, is very quick and does not stay still for long.

The Yellowhammer

The Yellowhammer is another bird that is more likely to be seen on the outskirts of a village and then only if it's surrounded by farmers' fields.





They tend to be ground feeders and are very skittish when people are near. Some can be a very vivid yellow while others have yellow heads but have a more brownish body. Not common in the garden but can be seen in the fields.

Siskins

Siskins are quite small birds - about blue tit size - and are very different in appearance. The male (bottom left) is a very, very bright yellow with a very pronounced black cap.

The females (bottom right) tend to be less bright but I think much more beautiful.

They are not all yellow; mainly white with some stripes and a slight cap on their heads. They love sunflower hearts (as most birds do).



Food Station

ur village food station, located in St Mary's Church, was set up in December 2022 by Lenham local Sharon Prior and borough councillors Janetta and Tom Sams. The food station's available to anyone who needs a helping hand; it's very well-used and provides support to our community by freeing up family budgets, which is particularly necessary with the rising cost-of-living. There's a similar initiative in Harrietsham at St John the Baptist Church, funded from the local County Councillor contribution and funding from a Harrietsham Charity, supported by volunteers and the local community, in a similar way to Lenham.

Support along the way

Many local groups and organisations have been very generous with assistance to set up and keep the food station going. St Mary's Church provides the space and the electricity for the fridge, which was purchased by grant funding from a recycling charity. The Lenham-based Hatch charity, which supports local initiatives, has donated substantial funding; Lenham Primary School has made huge donations of food and toiletries by raising money on non-uniform days and at their Harvest Festival; The Holigans have donated money from their performance; Kent County Councillor Shellina Prendergast has helped to fund the food station by assigning county budget to it. We thank them all for their support.

How does it work?

Our caring community does a fabulous job in supporting the food station, with locals donating food and toiletries on a regular basis. A group of dedicated volunteers work to keep the food station

running smoothly. The M & S/BP garage and Harrietsham Co-op donate their surplus food every day. Lenham Co-op has a food station collection point in store where shoppers can buy an extra item with their shopping and then pop it into the drop-off box. The food is collected, taken to St Mary's, arranged and checked on a daily basis by the rota of volunteers. Tom & Janetta supplement the donations with regular shopping for staple items. We're so grateful for all of the support which enables this necessary community endeavour to continue.

A wonderful new grant

The food station has just been awarded a substantial additional grant by Southern Co-op, as part of their latest initiative working with over 60 local community food stations right across the region. Southern Co-op members have helped to make a difference by buying their regular groceries and then scanning their Southern Coop membership cards – the Co-op has donated 2p to food station partners for each membership card scan. This grant has seen a fabulous £1,200 bolster our Lenham food station coffers. The funding will allow additional supplies to be purchased and will ensure that the food station keeps running for longer. We'd like to thank Southern Co-op for this grant, Lenham Co-op for nominating our food station to receive support and Southern Co-op members for swiping their membership cards.

Can you help?

Do you have some time to help with collection and delivery of supplies to the food station? Extra volunteers would help to share the load and would maybe allow weekend collections as currently we are only making collections Monday-Friday. 



hen you read this, it will be somewhere around 1st April, or April Fool's Day when traditionally people play little, but hopefully not unkind, tricks on each other up to midday.

More importantly, this year 1st April will also be Easter Monday so celebration will be in the air, the taste of chocolate eggs may well be on our lips and Spring flowers will be brightening up the village, reminding us about new life and the Good News of Jesus' resurrection. Thoughts of Lent will be becoming a distant memory.

But as I write this, Lent is in full swing. I am half way through a Lent course; last night friends quizzed me about what I might have given up or taken on for the month and this morning I attended a Lenten Reflection gathering at Canterbury Cathedral.

One of the Lent course exercises was a practice, devised by Ignatius of Loyola in the 16th century, to read a passage from the Bible and then re-read it again taking on the character of one of the people in the story. One of the Lenten reflection exercises was Lectio Divina, a practice which began as far back as the 6th Century, where we read a passage and then slowly re-read it again, each time thinking of a poignant word or verse on which we could meditate, ponder and pray, enjoying being in the presence of God.

These are well known methods of helping us to look at, and dig deeper, into a Bible story in order to have a personal encounter

with God and discover new insights. The Easter Day Gospel reading this year is Mark 16 verses 1-8, where we read about the miraculous rising of our Lord from the grave and his appearance to Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, at the tomb, after they found that the stone had been rolled away.

It is a beautiful but well-known passage, which you may have heard about many times before so I would urge you to read it and then read it again, applying one of these techniques. I can't predict what you will experience but pray that it brings you joy and a little nearer to our Lord who sent his only son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ, to free the world from sin and offer us all eternal life.




