#### Royal British Legion, 13 November

This year saw around 20 members from HMS Intrepid association join in our annual parade. HMS Intrepid was a flagship during the Falklands and one of the best known ships for the part in which it played. Members who served on Intrepid joined together for their annual reunion in Bilsthorpe. Russell Morgan and local resident Paul Prest opened the service at Bilsthorpe Welfare by ringing the ship's bell. Margaret Groves led the service in which members of the Royal British Legion, HMS Intrepid, and 1st Bilsthorpe Scouts presented their standard. After the service the parade was led jointly by the Royal British Legion and HMS Intrepid and preceded down to the memorial where the names of the fallen were read out by David Ramsdale, President of the RBL Branch. The last post and Reveille was played by Robert Mariner. Keeley Ward, Chair of Bilsthorpe RBL laid the first wreath followed by representatives from HMS Intrepid, 1st Bilsthorpe Scouts (all sections), St John Ambulance, Bilsthorpe Heritage Museum, Bilsthorpe Parish Council and Bilsthorpe Flying High Academy. Members of the community also laid wreaths and poppies whilst paying their respects.




