

This year the beginning of Lent starts on 5<sup>th</sup> March (Ash Wednesday). Lent comes from an old English word meaning 'lengthen'. Lent is in spring, when the days begin to get longer or lengthen. It's believed the Church has kept a period of fasting in the weeks before Easter for at least the last 1,500 years. This fast reminds Christians that they are dependent upon God for everything, just as Jesus was when he spent those 40 days in the wilderness being tempted. Hopefully those spiritual disciplines of fasting, prayer, reading the Bible, self-denial, giving to help those in need, selfexamination, and repentance draws Christians closer to God and prepares them for the great celebration of Easter.

I am reminded of a story in the Bible about a man called Jonah. God told him to go to Nineveh in Assyria (now Iraq) to warn his enemies they were going to be judged for their wickedness.

Jonah didn't want to go and do this, so he ran away in the opposite direction. That was how he ended up being thrown overboard a ship and then inside a giant fish (or whale) for three days and nights. After that experience, Jonah agreed to do what God asked him, and he was spat out on to dry land. Jonah went to Nineveh and told the people they will be overthrown in 40 days. Surprisingly the people listened to Jonah and declared a fast across that great city. The people repented and changed their evil ways, so God had mercy and did not bring the disaster upon them.

That seems like a nice ending to the story except that Jonah was not happy about it. He became angry that God would have compassion on his enemy. He only wanted God's goodness to be shown to him and his people, not them.

Jonah became so bitter and angry that he wanted to die, but God explained to him that he loves all people, not just one particular group.

This story makes me think of two important things. Firstly, sometimes it's important for us to do things we don't want to do. It may be inconvenient for us but perhaps it will be life changing for others if we do.

Secondly, during this time of Lent when Christians traditionally think more about repentance and self-examination, it's important for us all not to judge others, as tempting as it might be. It's never too late to say sorry and change our ways. We may think others deserve punishment, but they might respond better to love and compassion. As it says in the Bible, God's kindness is intended to lead us to repentance. I hope you will take the time to reflect upon this story and let it speak to you today.





#### Remembering...

#### **Oliver James Colman**

8<sup>th</sup> February 1933 - 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2024

Some excerpts from the funeral tribute for Oliver Colman given by his daughter, Milla Adeney.

There were two things that Oliver was quite specific about for his funeral:

First, that the occasion should take place at Saint Andrew's Church, a place he cherished. He had spent a number of years as church warden there; his children, Tom and Milla were christened there, Milla was married there, and all Oliver's grandchildren were christened there at the lovely baptismal font.

Second, Oliver specified he just didn't want fuss, I am sure he would be thinking, "why have an obituary in the Hill & Valley parish magazine?"; because he couldn't imagine what anyone would have to say about him! Well, that comment kind of sums up Oliver: genuinely modest, unassuming and thoughtful with a gentle sense of humour.

Oliver was a listener and a thinker; he REALLY listened in a way that many don't. He always read up and read around a subject, in fact, he read a lot. Oliver often had a newspaper or a book in his hand; though he was always ready to put the book to one side, take off his glasses and have a conversation - he always did enjoy a good discussion with friends and family! He knew so much, and was so generous with his knowledge; he would talk as if you knew as much as he did and never puff off or seem to notice the fact that he knew far more and in much more detail; and always treated others as intellectual equals, children and adults alike.

Oliver combined his love of books with his entrepreneurial side as he established a career in publishing, and quietly behind the scenes took over as the publisher for William Kimber books. Mainly military books. Oliver liked to be involved in all aspects of the business – particularly enjoying the precision of picture placement within the books which he often continued at home. He still enjoyed reading, even if it was the day job too – and on holiday, would rather sit in the shade with a book than be on the beach in the sunshine!

Oliver loved and appreciated nature, plants and animals and once he and Cynthia found the Cottage, in Hurstbourne Park then, really, where Dad wanted to be was in the garden, it's where he truly relaxed and enjoyed building bonfires and

starting new life with those green fingers. Oliver told me his interest in gardening began properly when his prep school was evacuated from Seaford during the war, and as far as I can tell, most of his formative education was delivered by gardeners or groundsmen at school, and then back at home on the Malshanger estate, near Basingstoke where he grew up, therefore learning a great deal about plants overall! Rather like his approach to people, Oliver offered plants a framework, a trellis, gave them what they needed and then let them follow their own course without too much intervention.

Oliver had a strong faith and enjoyed being a churchwarden at St. Andrew's. Contributing time and energy to local events such as the May Fair and running the bottle stall amongst friends. Oliver also had many other interests, Opera and cricket among them!

So, to conclude, I hope we all feel richer for knowing this self-reliant, humble, intellectual, thoughtful, spiritual, kind, generous, and loving man, a father, husband, grandfather, uncle, cousin, colleague and friend, I certainly do.

Answer: both Sir Robert Oxenbridge (1558) and employees of the Bank of England (1940) evacuated to Hurstbourne Park (also to Whitchurch and Overton) to escape danger in London.

It was a huge change, especially for the young women clerks, now having to live in the quiet countryside, sleeping in temporary dormitories and working in wooden huts. They let off steam in an entertainment in which the following song was sung...

Verses from *Evacuation Blues*, words by Molly Eagling and Dorothy Smart, March 1940 (Tune: Young Folk, Old Folk, Everybody Come)

In the wilds of Hampshire Among the cows and pigs, Montague's\* young ladies Are living out in digs. The rooms are very crowded, With twenty in a bed, But we're all girls together So nothing need be said.

Join the Monty follies and
Remember you're still young.
Queue up for your breakfast,
Queue up for your tea,
Queue up when you want to wash

## History of the Hill & Valley area in Ten Objects 2 Hurstbourne Priors Letter Box




A Victorian curio, but well-documented (thanks to Colin and Precelly Murray). The photo shows the 1861 type WB75/ii wall box, at The Long House, 49 Hurstbourne Priors. Cast by Smith & Hawkes, in their foundry at Birmingham, the distinctive feature of this type of box is the large hood. But Harry Plunket Greene, famous singer and fly-fisherman, who lived with his family at The Long House in the early years of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, could not have used it. It has only been here since 1928, when it was transferred from Pamber End, north of Basingstoke.





help; therefore we were all very excited when we had a visitor on the school field - a heron.


We have been looking at ways to enhance the children's playtimes and have been listening to the




#### **Postcard from Binley**

It's been a drab day here in Binley. The bright, sharp weather of the last month with that bitingly cold north easterly has been replaced by a mild damp front. Dogs go to the open door and stare glumly at the rain before cocking a leg in the porch and huffing and puffing their way back to their beds by the fire. Tea is brewed, biscuits munched, books picked up and put down again as the hours are whiled away. But a brightening up in the late afternoon sees me out and leaning on a rusty gate in the corner of a meadow as dusk gathers around me. Above, an old buzzard calls for its mate. Believe it or not this is known as "mewing", and he'll soon head to his usual roost down the cattle drove. Back in July this meadow was a sea of buttercups, and I was here one evening trying to call in some fox cubs I'd seen about using that squeaky, kissy sound I've seen keepers use. I had no intention of harming them, I just wanted to see if I could do it. They were the reddest, earthiest cubs I'd ever seen but, on this occasion, too wily for me. What I did move however, was a weasel who popped his head up not three feet from me. But I'm not here tonight for fox cubs, buzzards or weasels. I'm here for Binley's most secretive creature. The Polecat! There has been a colony of Polecats here in Binley for as long as I have knocked about here, and I am certain now roughly where their home is. When you first see one you are usually a little confused. I can remember my brain thinking I'd just seen a skunk but of course their bandit type black face markings can throw you. They'll feed mostly on small rodents, birds and amphibians, but one ghastly but nevertheless interesting fact about them is, that they will often cripple their prey by piercing its brain with their teeth and then store it, still living, in their burrow for future consumption.

With pipistrelles fluttering around my ears and no sign of a polecat I check my watch. It's one of those diver's jobs and it's a ridiculous thing covered in dials and switches, and I'm told good for 100 metres of water pressure. I don't know what half of it does. It's got a shark resistant strap... I think to be honest, if all he wants is your watch it's probably best to let him have it. Thinking back to the only diving I've ever done it was considered bad manners to check your watch so there you are!

I have a wedding to attend and have been asked to do a reading. It's at a country hotel in Herefordshire; they are country people, and I have been told "nothing religious". Fair enough. So, I have waded through the usual suspects, Kipling (exceedingly good cakes), Hardy, Bronte, Lee but have settled on reading an excerpt from "The Wind in the Willows". It's the bit where Toad finds himself in prison and the jailor's daughter takes pity on him and brings him bubble and squeak and "hot buttered toast, cut thick, very brown on both sides with the butter running

through the holes in it in great golden drops like honey from the honeycomb." A reflective Toad starts to understand that the material things in life are not the be all and end all, it's actually the simple things we take for granted. The whole piece reminds me how important friendships are, how families are when we gather around a table with food to share but more than that, it's one of those special books that spans generations, makes one terribly nostalgic for how the countryside once was, but also the values we once held. Give it another read.

## LONGPARISH WILDLIFE by Chris Bowman THE LONG-TAILED TIT



One of my favourite small birds, a small bundle of feathers on a stick. In the winter Long-Tailed Tits gather in small to large flocks which include other birds. When out on my travels around the village i look forward to finding a flock. They range from a small flock to over 20, but it's also what is with them that is of interest. I have found Blue, Coal and Great Tits, Nuthatches, Treecreepers, Goldcrests, Chiffchaff and Blackcaps. The largest flock I have seen is over 50 birds. They were flying over the road in front of me I thought they would never end.

They are 14cms long of which 9cms is the black and white tail. Their backs are black and pink and they have a white head with a wide black eye stripe and a pale pink belly. It's really nice if you are lucky enough to have them come to your bird feeders. They feed mostly on arthropods, especially bugs and their eggs. They start nesting in late February - late April with only one brood.

The nest is something extraordinary in a hedge or bramble patch I have even found one on the ground in brambles. It's a compact domed structure of moss woven with cobwebs and hair, covered in camouflaging greyish lichen, and lined with feathers and a small hole near the top. A nest was taken to bits after fledging and found to have over a 1000 feathers. The nest is expandable as they lay 8-12 eggs which hatch in 15 days and fledge in 14 days so if they all survive, the nest needs to expand. The parents are kept very busy, sometimes a failed pair will help with the feeding.

## Planting of Disease-resistant Elm Trees by Paul Knipe

The 'Greening Longparish Group' have carried out the planting of five disease-resistant elm saplings. These free saplings were supplied by the Hampshire Forest Partnership, part of HCC and follows on from Middleton Estate's tapping into the Scheme last year. Three trees have been planted along the Spinal Path and two on the Village Green, along the hedgerow with Upper Mill.



The thinking behind this initiative is to plant the saplings in the many existing elm hedgerows in the village, which, being resistant to Dutch Elm

Disease fungus, will grow into mature trees. This is important to the life-cycle of the rare white-letter hairstreak butterfly whose larvae feed on elm leaves. In addition, the mature trees act as 'mast trees' (as in ships' masts) as mating posts for the adult butterflies.

A disease-resistant variety 'Adamez', isolated in Catalonia in Spain, has been chosen, as being the closest in appearance to



our native Small-leaved Elm.







#### **Dennis Luff**



1937 - 2025

Dennis was born on 6 December 1937, the fourth child of Dorothy and Arthur Luff and the first baby to be born in the new council houses at North Acre.

After school he went to work on Middleton Farm for Capt Wills

until he was called up for his National Service.
On returning home he went back to farm work for a short time before starting at Kennedy and Kempe, the local engineering works, as a welder. He was made redundant from there in the late sixties and started at Stoner and Saunders in Andover. In 1981 he was made redundant again. He and friends, Barry and Vic, started their own business – DBV Fabrications in a unit on Thruxton Industrial Estate. They made fire escapes, metal staircases and railings. Dennis retired when he was 64 as he needed a hip replacement and the heavy work was becoming difficult.

He met Barbara when playing football for Barton Stacey and they married in April 1965 They had 59 wonderful years together. Of course, they had to get married in April as it was between the football and cricket season. She learnt to love football and cricket and became scorer and secretary.

Cricket was Dennis's main love. He started playing for Longparish when he was 14. He was offered trials for Hampshire when he was 15 but had to turn it down as his parents couldn't afford for him to keep travelling to Southampton.

He scored over 31,000 runs for Longparish including 55 centuries. Although renowned for his batting, in his earlier days he was also a fast bowler, taking 707 wickets. The highlight for him, however, was Lord's in 1980 when Longparish reached the final of the Whitbread Village Cup Competition.

Despite having both hips replaced, one of them three times, and a knee replacement Den never complained and was always actively doing something, still enjoying life. But, this last year took its toll with a series of strokes, which resulted

in other problems. He fought hard but he could not recover from his last bout of pneumonia and passed away peacefully with Barbara by his side.
