Community Hall recieves grant

Mabe Community Hall has received a £7000 grant from the Falmouth Packet to replace and update the hot water heating and central heating boiler, all of which is well over 20 year old and not anywhere as efficient as the modern boiler.

The present system no longer heats hot water; users have to boil kettles, in addition to using the dish washer. Also at times, the central heating system needs human intervention to start, then at other times it works when not required. Blue Flame will be installing a very modern energy efficient system in the next few weeks. Keith Bryant This was selected as one of the best new-build power vessels built in the last 12 months. Second defibrillator unit

Steve Nisbett, the owner of Mabe Stores and Post Office, has just accepted delivery of the second defribulator unit for Mabe.

The new unit, and the first one installed outside of the Community Hall, has 24 hour access. Access to the units are via Ambulance Control, who should be the first point of contact, in the event of a cardiac arrest.

All the money for the 2 units was raised by fundraising and donations within the village. The Parish Council has agreed to guarantee the maintenance costs for the next five years, but public support is also helping. Mabe Age Concern Lunch Club collected £60 instead of sending Christmas Cards to one another this Christmas. The Chairman of the Lunch Club presented it to the Chairman of the Parish Council, Andrew Thomas, at their Christmas Lunch just before Christmas.

Steve Nisbett also has a collection box in the shop to help towards the annual maintenance cost; please support it if you visit the Shop or Post Office.

Fund raising organiser Keith Bryant is very greatful to everyone in the area who helped, some paying penalties in their sports, some helping to run the many events involved and most importantly, all those who were so good as to raise the £5,700 that was required to give the village 24 hour access to valuable lifesaving equipment.

Despite recommendations from Highways and Cornwall Council planning officers to reject this application (PA16/11983), members of the strategic planning committee appear to be broadly in favour, and voted to defer their decision to February while more details are drawn up on S106 agreements. Cont. opposite

The scheme is huge, covering eight fields and includes a new roundabout on the A39, shops, cafés, a pub, a budget hotel, leisure facilities and office space, as well as housing for 2000 students and a park and ride scheme for 474 cars.

Mabe Parish Council was well represented by Cllr Peter Tisdale who outlined our reasons for objecting to the development, but councillors noted that there were very few objectors in the public gallery, and that the majority of public comments had been in support. This is undoubtedly because the residents of Falmouth and Penryn are keen to see students housed away from the towns. However, now that a number of sites in Falmouth have had their planning applications granted on appeal, together with a gradual fall in student numbers nationally, there is not an identified need for student accommodation on such a large scale. If you feel strongly about this development, make sure your voice is heard. Go to www.cornwall.
