RESULTS OF THE VOTING FOR THE GREEN SPACES SPEND


The full results of the voting are shown at the end of this WIN. The recommendation to the Parish Council is that (in order of preference) West Ilsley would like to spend the money on:

WELL READING

Good news from the Malthouse well this month. The water level has risen about 5 metres during January which thankfully is about half the increase we experienced during the same period last year. As the WIN goes to press the water level stands at 12.16 metres which is way below the critical level for the village. This time last year the water level was rising rapidly every day and as we all know led to the flooding that started on 8/9 February. The graph below shows the difference between then and now.



JANUARY'S FARMING NEWS

Even though we feel we have not had the equivalent rainfall to last year the ground conditions still appear to be very wet. Nevertheless we have just started applying some Kieserite which contains the trace elements of magnesium and sulphur onto the winter oilseed rape crop and for this work we require no rain and

minimal winds. After this we will be applying some Triple Super Phosphate on some of the winter oilseed rape and winter wheat crops at Chilton. All these elements are beneficial to the growth and development of the crops.

Last week we wormed and brought in the pregnant ewes to Folly barns to give them better nutrition (sheep cake and hay) and shelter prior to them giving birth to their lambs towards the end of February and beginning of March.

Meanwhile the cattle are happily stored in the Coldharbour barns where they are fed and sheltered until the spring when the weather conditions improve sufficiently to turn them out.

January, named after the two-faced Roman god Janus, a name derived from ianua, the latin word for door, January being the door to the year and Janus was the god who controlled doors and beginnings. Two faced because one face looks back to the year departed, and one looks forward to the year ahead.

January's birth flower is the Snowdrop and a few of these are showing their nodding heads in the garden, interspersed with the yellow of winter aconites. A spectacular display of snowdrops will be on view at Welford Park from the 28th of the month.

On the bird front it is the winter visitors that stand out. On a recent shoot fifteen short eared owls were flushed by the beaters from a field of stubble turnips. Fieldfare and redwing are still present in good numbers. The highlight of the month however was a flock of one hundred golden plover between Abbott's Heath and Sheep Down. Update from the Royal British Legion – Compton, Ilsleys and Norreys Branch

Our members wish all readers a very happy, healthy and prosperous 2015.

It is with pleasure that we can tell you that our newly structured team of village Poppy Appeal Organisers (PAOs) collected a total of £3,600 for this charity from the villages of Aldworth, Compton, East Ilsley, West Ilsley and Hampstead Norreys. To everyone who contributed and wore their poppies with pride last November - an enormous thank you for your generosity.

The Branch held its Remembrance Sunday parade and service in Aldworth on 9th November - we rotate the event on an annual basis around our catchment villages. Those parading, RBL members, Youth Groups and supporters, assembled outside the Bell Inn under the direction of the Parade Marshal and Branch Chairman Steve Allison, and then marched to Saint Mary's Church in the sunshine led by piper Ian Knight and RBL branch standard bearer Mick Crockford. It was a special occasion befitting the centenary year, as the WWI war poet, Lawrence Binyon, is buried at Aldworth Church. It is the fourth verse of his poem "For the Fallen" that is used as the exhortation by the RBL at all Remembrance services.

The congregation was delighted to welcome two of Lawrence Binyon's grandsons, Edmund Gray and Jonathan Higgs, to the event. The congregation of 200 plus gathered round the War Memorial located outside the church before the service, led by the Rev Will Watts, continued inside. The Exhortation was spoken by Branch President Julian Jeffs QC and Peter Whitworth, vice Chairman read out the names of the Aldworth fallen. The Last Post and Reveille were beautifully

played by 16 year old Aimee Jones. A two minute silence was observed at 11 o'clock and Wreaths were then laid.

This year 2015 the Branch's Remembrance Parade and Service will be held in West Ilsley.

Our annual charity lunch, in aid of the Poppy Appeal, was held on Friday 21st November at the White Hart Hampstead Norreys. 30 people attended and we were very well catered for by James & Tracey Stanley. Our guest speaker was Major Tikendra Dewan from the British Gurkha Welfare Society who gave an interesting briefing on the approximately 10,000 Gurkha families resident in UK and a resume of the society's activities.
