Parish Council Projects

Now the budget process has been completed, the Council would like to tell you about the future projects for 2018-2019.

The PC still has budget for a mobile Speed Indicator Device, play equipment for Elvington fenced area for youth play and a pathway on Wigmore Lane, these are on-going from 2017-2018 along with the set-up of allotments behind Adelaide Road.

New projects are Battles over Campaign and a statue of a WW1 Tommy to stand by the rose garden on Eythorne roundabout. Parish Improvements has been given some earmarked funds and a project looking at village signs and Public Rights of Way notice boards. Also a new container at Elvington Community Centre to hold the gardening equipment.
