Chalkhill House. Whiteways. Erection of single storey extension. **Granted**

Robinswood, Pound Lane. Change of roofing material. **Granted**

The Bothy. Installation of replacement sewage treatment works. **Granted**

Wallinford House, Middle St. Apple tree reduction **Granted**

School Lane rear of Woodview. Erection of dwelling. **Granted**

Footpaths--- No real problems throughout the year although some styles have not been repaired

Pot Holes ----- Numerous have been reported the local authority and the majority have been repaired. Councillor Uden arranged through a Dorset Council contact to have the road markings repainted. This was completed within days.

Dewlish Transport---- Is still being advertised so therefore being used

Grass Cutting. Continues in the triangle at the bottom of Pound Lane as well as the area at the top of School Lane.

Defibrillators . Both in Middle St and outside the Oak remain in working order and as far as I know have not been used

The Green at the bottom of Pound Lane. Having asked the villagers whether the green should be refurbished the response was overwhelmingly yes with only 2 against. It was agreed by councillors at a later meeting and councillor Chris Uden has started work on this and we will receive his report later.
