# From the Vicar

I'm writing this on 18th October, as I scan the news headlines regularly to keep abreast of the terrible events in Israel and Gaza. The recent Hamas attacks on Israeli citizens were despicable; and the Israeli response has led to the unjustifiable and tragic death of many civilians, including innocent children. Israel and Palestine are currently arguing over who is to blame for the explosion which killed almost 500 people at the Al-Ahli Arab hospital in Gaza City. Israel's threatened attack on Gaza "by air, sea and land" has not yet materialised – but I live in fear that, by the time you read this, Gaza City will be no more. I fear, too, for all those who have fled Gaza City and who seek sanctuary elsewhere in the Gaza strip – waiting, and praying, for the border with Egypt to open so that food, water and medical supplies can be taken into Gaza, and those who wish can leave. The situation in the Gaza strip is desperate. It's a humanitarian crisis. I also fear that Iran, Lebanon and other nations will be drawn into the conflict, and that the conflict will continue to escalate, and spiral out of control. Meanwhile the ongoing conflicts in Ukraine, and many other nations, show little sign of abating. Sometimes it's hard not to despair, not to lose hope, not to fear for the future.

Several friends shared the following prayer on social media today, offered by The Methodist Church:

*Loving God*

*I see the news and I am afraid.*

*Violence is spiralling out of control.*

*I don't know what to think or feel.*

*The temptation to fall into hatred, or despair  
feels very close at hand.*

*Help me to remember that nothing in all creation  
can separate me from your love  
that I know in Jesus.*

*May your perfect love for me cast out my fear  
and free me to discern what is mine to do  
amidst the chaos of this suffering world.*

*Amen.*

Perhaps you could pray this prayer, as you continue to pray for peace in the Holy Land, for the release of all hostages; and for an end to the cycle of oppression, violence and retribution.

On 5th November, while the nation remembers Guy Fawkes' foiled plot to blow up Parliament, the church will celebrate our Patronal Festival of All Saints', during which we celebrate the great company of saints who surround us. We also have an opportunity – at our annual Service of Light, at 3pm on 5th November - to remember, and give thanks for, our own loved ones, family and friends who gave us life and love, or who nurtured us in faith. And on the following Sunday, we remember those who gave, or lost, their lives in war; and we reflect upon the terrible cost of war, as we continue to pray for peace. All are always welcome to any of our services – and to pop into church whenever it is open (almost every day) to pray, or just to enjoy the peace and tranquillity of our beautiful church.

All Saints' Church has been a beacon of hope and light, on "God's Holy Hill" for hundreds of years, offering a sacred space for divine encounter, prayer, worship, celebrations, and personal and national lamentation, remembrance and mourning. I hope that you will consider becoming a Friend of All Saints' Church, so that we can continue to serve the local community, and promote the values of justice, love, peace, faith and hope, for generations to come. 



# Parish Council

All three new councillors attended October's meeting. It is good to have the Parish Council back to full strength again after several months with only four councillors.

From time to time the Parish Council investigates whether any changes can be made in the village to improve traffic safety. Most recently Tim Bearder, our County Councillor, has been pressing for a 20mph speed limit to be introduced and so residents are being canvassed on their opinions about this.

One area where the traffic is fast is on the way into Cuddesdon past Parkside. Suggestions on how to reduce the traffic speed in this area include white safety gates mounted on the verge, which have the psychological effect of slowing the traffic, or an electric sign which flashes up vehicles' speeds as they pass.

Each year we have a RoSPA inspection of the play equipment on the recreation ground to make sure it is safe. The latest inspection confirmed that the goal posts are becoming rusty at the bottom so we are investigating having them replaced. We fitted new goal nets recently but the frames are the original ones bought 17 years ago.

We have had the two tree stumps removed on Denton Green and on Cuddesdon Green near the churchyard entrance.

We have asked the County Council to clean the roadside drains, many of which are overflowing. I do not believe the drains have been cleared for at least six years.

The planning application with design revisions to the new house at Upper Farm in Denton (P23/S2093/S73) has been approved by the District Council. The revised application for a garage in the garden of 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S1892/HH) has been refused because it is considered to be an inappropriate development in the green belt.

The structure of Government, national and local, can be confusing. When someone needs help with something it can be difficult to know just who is responsible for what, and therefore who can help when things do not go as they should. I often receive requests from people to help them with issues that are not parliamentary matters and with which I cannot help. I appreciate that this can be frustrating and so I thought that it might help if I set out who does what.

It is often thought that an MP sits at the top of a hierarchy of Government and has power to direct local councils. This is not the case. Local councils are autonomous, and MPs do not have any jurisdiction over local council decisions. Hence local councils have their own elected representatives in the form of councillors. People elected to these councils have direct access to officers at the respective councils and so are better placed to take up relevant issues. I have found that referring to local councillors is the quickest way to get action.

So, to help steer through the hierarchy let me set out who does what. Essentially as an MP I can help with issues and concerns that relate to central government departments. In Oxfordshire we have three tiers of local government, the County Council, District Councils and Parish Councils or Parish Meetings. Oxfordshire County Council is responsible for local services such as education, social services, transport, roads, rights of way, libraries, the fire service, and bus subsidies. The constituency is served by two district councils, Cherwell and South Oxfordshire. They are responsible for local services, including planning, housing, rubbish collection, environmental services, leisure services, some car parks and council tax collection. Parish Councils and Parish Meetings deal with very local concerns and can influence the other councils on behalf of residents.

Whilst on the topic of what I can and cannot do it may also be helpful to comment on requests to attend specific events. When Parliament is sitting MPs are expected to be in Westminster from Monday to Thursday, unless on other parliamentary business elsewhere. During a week in Westminster there are many competing demands such as scrutinising legislation, attending debates, committees, and other meetings. These competing demands mean that it is not always possible to attend a particular debate or drop-in session that a constituent may ask me to attend.






