# New Member of Parish Council

As you will know from the Minutes of the AGM, Brian Hall has stood down from the Parish Council, as he is no longer able to attend as many meetings as he felt were appropriate for the role. The Parish Council thanks him for his years of service and efforts in aid of the community. The resultant vacancy on the Parish council was advertised, but only one individual was willing to put his name forward, It is therefore with pleasure that the Parish Council invited Richard Steel to become a member, which he did at the recent PC Meeting. Richard introducec himself thus:

Having just been confirmed as Brian Hall's replacement on Acol Parish Council, and attended my first meeting as a Councillor, I'd like to take this opportunity to say hello.

My wife, Chris, and I moved to Acol at the end of June, last year. We enjoy walking and cycling, and our only difficulty in deciding to move here was in our realisation that the village had little pedestrian provision, and was increasingly used as a traffic "ratrun" to avoid the Birchington bottleneck, or the inconvenience of having to use the sign-posted routes via the A299. The traffic, and driving standards, seem to have grown still worse in the short time we've been here, and we've both had "close shaves" with speeding motorists while out walking, so, I am, of course, absolutely committed to supporting the Council's fight for a bypass, and measures to calm traffic through our village.

With that in mind, I volunteered to work with Speedwatch, last October. The scheme is under new management, rolling-out initial training online, and supposed to be provided with new equipment. However, I've been dismayed at the length of time it's taking to sort these matters out - as are my fellow Councillors - so hoping our efforts to get the scheme back on-track will soon be rewarded so that I can get to work!

I also volunteered to form a Community Litter Picking Group (and was involved in a similar initiative in Gravesend, where Chris and I moved from). Like many communities, Acol has problems with litter, much of which, in our case, seems to come from fast food packaging disposed of as people travel through the village. The Council has agreed to fund necessary equipment and high visibility clothing, but I'm looking for other volunteers to join me in occasional litter-picks. Please get in touch!

Aside from traffic hazards and litter, Chris and I love our new home and the area in which we live. We've been especially struck by people's friendliness, and hope to reciprocate the warm welcome we've enjoyed through what help and support we can offer as active members of the community.

I look forward to meeting more of my fellow villagers in the coming weeks and months.
