SOUTH HUISH PARISH HOUSING NEEDS SURVEY

The Parish of South Huish is developing a Neighbourhood Plan (SHNP) to establish planning and other community policies over the next 20 years. This housing needs survey will inform that work. The policies set in the SHNP (once it is adopted under the terms of the National Planning Policy Framework on the basis it generally conforms to the strategic policies of the Plymouth & West Devon Joint Local Plan 2014-2034) will take precedence for planning purposes where there is conflict with other plans. Indeed, once it is in force, where planning applications conflict with the SHNP planning permission will not normally be granted.

This Housing Needs Survey will result in evidence essential to development of policies in the SHNP. Additionally it officially draws SHDC into development of the SHNP, as SHDC will analyse the output of this survey, from the perspective of one of the 'owners' of the Plymouth & West Devon Joint Local Plan, against which the SHNP needs to prove its 'conformity' before it can be brought into force.

This HNS is focussed on those permanently living and/or working in the parish; i.e. primary residents, long term resident tenants, those on the electoral roll and those who have long term employment in the parish. We would request all to complete Part 1 of the survey and Part 2 as applicable. With respect to Part 2 of this survey, additional questionnaires can be requested form the Parish Clerk (clerk.southhuishpc@gmail.com) to cover:

- Young people or couples setting up home for the first time;
- People who have moved from the Parish but wish to return permanently;
- People who work in the Parish and wish to move permanently to the Parish;
- People that are looking for housing that is more affordable.

We would be grateful if you would return the completed questionnaire in the envelope provided to either the Hope Cove or Malborough Post Offices by 30th April 2017.

For the purposes of confidentiality and data protection, the information you provide will be used by the SHNP development committee to develop a Housing Needs Survey Report that will inform the Neighbourhood Plan. No data will be published that can identify an individual or individuals.
