Matters Arising: Insurance – have renewed with the current provider after negotiating a better price **Village Hall:** Subject to final confirmation of costings, it was agreed to appoint one of the contractors who had submitted a tender. It was agreed to authorise a spend of a further £700 to complete the disabled path to the new front door. Letters will be sent to the other two unsuccessful tendering contractors. The grant application was discussed and Marina Thompson will submit a revised form accordingly.

Village Design Statement: Further to a meeting with the Planning Dept at Kelham Hall, the planners have insisted that the consultation process used to formulate the VDS should be documented – Marina Thompson & Andrew Paris to put together the required information. The District Council stated that they would be prepared to consider the present VDS document as the Parish's consultation document when formulating the new Local Development Framework – it was agreed unanimously to write to the planners stating that this was what was wanted by the Parish Council. Andrew Paris to draft letter for next meeting.

Wall at Bramley, Halam Hill: It is understood that retrospective planning is being applied for, in which case any enforcement action is put on hold. Situation to be monitored.

Proposed Parish Council Annual Report: it was unanimously agreed that an Annual Report should be circulated with the Halam News. Format to be agreed, but generally the Report would be a written record of the Chairman's statement to the village from the Annual Meeting.



The wildflowers included Greater Stitchwort, White Campion, Bird's Foot Trefoil and Lady's Bedstraw. The project gave children a chance to identify and understand more about the many wildflowers and plants that are native to their local environment. It also gave the children the opportunity to work with Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust in undertaking a survey of all the wildflowers growing in the churchyard. Over forty different varieties of plants were identified.

LEST WE FORGET

On the night of 10th April 1943 at 01:25 hours, Avro Lancaster ED823 flying from RAF Winthorpe on a night navigation exercise crashed on what is now the 14th green of Norwood Park Golf Course (adjacent to School Lane). Tragically, all of the crew, 4 British, 4 Australians, and a Canadian,

(average age 23 and 3/4 years) all lost their lives. Their last resting place is understood to be the area from where they originated.

However, it is a sad reflection that there is no memorial in Halam to recognise their sacrifice. We hope to rectify this omission by erecting a modest memorial to their name.

All aspects of raising money to fund this will be looked into - including, but not limited to support from the RAF & local authorities etc, but local fund raising will be needed as well, and hopefully some village events will be

organised to help raise money.

In mid October, the District Council will publish its Core Strategy Options Report. This is the latest document from our Local Development Framework (LDF) – a set of planning documents which outline how development will be managed in the District. It will set out the Council's vision for Newark and Sherwood District up to

2026 and give an opportunity for comments to be made about the choices that have to be taken. The Core Strategy will be one of the most important parts of the LDF because all the other planning policy documents which will be included in the LDF will take the principles of the Core Strategy as their basis. As parts of the LDF are adopted, elements of the existing Local Plan, the precursor to the LDF, will be replaced. We want you to help us shape the future for our District. Public consultation lasts for 8 weeks. It will be published on the Council's website at <u>www.newark-sherwooddc.gov.uk/planningpolicy</u> and will be placed in the District's Local Libraries. Public events will also be organised.

THE SHERWOOD FORESTERS WESTERN FRONT MEMORIAL

In the First World War 140,000 men, predominantly from Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire, fought in the ranks of their local infantry Regiment; The Sherwood Foresters. Over 11,000 of them were killed on the Western Front – the battlefields that stretched from Flanders in Belgium to Artois and Picardy in France.

Although a permanent war memorial to the Sherwood Foresters was built in Crich, on the border between Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire, there was no monument to the regiment on the Western Front itself. Last year a fund was set up to erect a monument in Tyne Cot Cemetery in Belgium, this being the largest Commonwealth War Graves Commission Cemetery in the world with nearly 12,000 soldiers buried there.

The cost of the memorial was donated by the Counties, Cities, Boroughs, Districts and Parish Councils of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire. Halam Parish Council contributed £30 towards this fund in memory of the village's own Sherwood Forester, Seth Hurt, whose name is recorded on the memorial in the Halam school wall.

On Saturday 24th October the monument was unveiled by The Queen's representatives, the Lord Lieutenants of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire in the presence of representatives from the Mercian Regiment (Worcesters & Foresters), local Belgian dignitaries, and about 300 guests from the UK representing Notts & Derbys Town and Parish Councils. The ceremony was stirring and a fitting tribute to the many local men killed in the Great War; it was made even more moving and poignant by the ongoing death toll of British troops in the war in Afghanistan.

The wording on the memorial reads:



In Memory of Over 11,000 all ranks of The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire & Derbyshire Regiment) who laid down their lives on the Western Front between 1914 and 1918

This memorial in Derbyshire stone has been made possible by the generosity of the people of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire



I hope to write a future article on Seth Hurt (8th Battalion, Sherwood Foresters) and would be interested to hear from anyone who has any information regarding him.

BUSINESSES: KNOW WHERE YOUR WASTE IS GOING

Council waste management officers are urging business owners to ensure their waste is properly disposed of in order to avoid potential prosecution.

The Environmental Protection Act 1990 provides councils with the powers to demand to see evidence of businesses' waste disposal arrangements. Failure to respond to that demand can result in a fine or court action if it is not paid.

As part of its anti-fly tipping measures, Newark & Sherwood District Council regularly makes checks with local businesses to ensure that the waste generated by that business is disposed of properly and is not available to be fly tipped.

This entails asking the business concerned what arrangements are in place to dispose of their rubbish. The council's cabinet member for clean and green issues, **Councillor Nora Armstrong**, said: "Businesses have a legal duty of care to make sure their waste is disposed of lawfully and, as up to 50% of all fly tipping in our area is business related, it is important that the council continues to support local companies in properly managing their waste.

"When we believe this is not happening we will not hesitate to take whatever action we think is necessary to keep our district clean and green."

MEDICAL WASTE IN THE HOME

Medical waste is broadly defined as:- human or animal tissue, bodily fluids, excretions, drugs, swabs, dressings, syringes or any waste from a vets, dentist, gp surgery or hospital. They are categorised into 5 groups A to E. Group A is mainly waste which is generated at a hospital which requires specialist disposal whilst Group D includes disposable bed pans and incontinence pads.

The type of waste generated at home may be from each different category. Dressings are from group A, syringes Group B, Drugs Group D whilst stoma products and incontinence pads are from group E. They all have one thing in common; they all need to be disposed of in the correct manner to ensure no contamination or health risks to any other person.

If you have been into hospital, receive care at home, or have a chronic illness, your health care professional may have told you about the '**yellow bag collection**'. This is a weekly collection for all disposable medical waste from your home. It ensures that this kind of waste is disposed of properly and not put into the green wheelie bin.

It is very easy to set up and reliable. All you do is contact **Newark & Sherwood District Council on 01636 655600** and ask to be put onto the **'yellow bag collection'**. A yellow bag and sheet of unique numbered labels will be sent to you along with information on the collection day. All you do is, put the items to be disposed of in the bag, tie the top, place 1 label on the outside of the bag and put outside your door on the appropriate day. This will be collected and a fresh bag left for you. Any syringes must be put into an appropriate box first before placing into the yellow sack.
