Parish Council Report

Autumn is well underway and, to quote a well-known TV show, "Winter is coming"! Your Parish Council are hard at work on the issues, challenges and opportunities that arise throughout the year. Planning applications are ever present and hopefully some of you will have been able to see the exhibition on 28th October laid on by the Old Vicarage on their extension scheme. This, along with other commercial and residential applications, will be reviewed by the PC as they progress through the application process. One thing we are keen to do is to work with the SODC planning officers on their use of planning conditions and subsequent enforcement when approvals are granted.

In the last Newsletter we discussed the challenge of school place allocations for Moulsford children. The promised survey can be found on the back page of this newsletter or at https://www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/83939MY

and we would really implore all parents with children under 18 to take part. The school information survey follows some questions about our playground facility as in addition to gathering the school information, we also need your feedback and input into the future of our village playground. You don't need to have young children to have your say, perhaps you are a grandparent, or perhaps you are an adult who would like to see some fitness equipment instead – we have the opportunity to consider all options but can only do this with your input. Another subject under discussion between the PC, Events Committee and Pavilion Management Committee is the question of single-use plastics. The nation-wide move to remove single-use plastics from use is growing rapidly, there are around 500 communities that have signed up to Surfers Against Sewage's plastic-free initiative so far and around 50 of those are now fully certified as plastic-free. Crowthorne in Berkshire is the closest certified plastic-free community to Moulsford. Does this initiative sound like something you would like to be involved with and make happen in Moulsford? We are very fortunate to live in the North Wessex Downs Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (NWD AONB) and the PC have agreed to become supporters of the North Wessex Downs Landscape Trust. The Trust aims to: "promote for the public the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment in the NWD AONB and its setting." We believe that involvement with the Trust will be highly beneficial in maintaining the environment we currently enjoy. From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My Dear Friends,

Remember, remember the 5th of November: Gunpowder, treason and plot. I see no reason why gunpowder, treason should ever be forgot... as the old rhyme used to go. In the midst of all the fun of fireworks, it is perhaps easy to forget that what is being commemorated is the deliverance of Parliament from being blown up by the terrorists of the day. In our present age, when terrorism has reared its ugly and violent head again, Guy Fawkes Day has much more relevance now than maybe it has had for many years.

It seems there have always been those who believe that they can overthrow injustice by exercising terrible violence not only against their enemies but against innocent bystanders as well. Even in the time of Jesus, there were those who thought the only way of getting the hated occupying Roman army out of Israel was by acts of violence. They were known at the time as *zealots*.

Amazingly, Jesus recruited one such zealot, Simon, to be one of his disciples. This was all the more extraordinary when Jesus made it extremely clear that *love* not violence was the only way of bringing about God's kingdom of justice and mercy. He is the one who taught his disciples to turn the other cheek, to love their enemies, and pray for those who persecuted them. Clearly Simon the Zealot's way of doing things before he met Jesus, was not something that Jesus would have approved of and yet he still called Simon to be one of his twelve disciples. Why?

The reason was that, as far as Jesus was concerned, no one was beyond the pale, whatever they had done in the past, however disreputable their reputation. The only requirement was a willingness to change. Simon the Zealot showed he had such willingness by agreeing to follow Jesus. The fact that Jesus believed in Simon, and could see his potential for good, had a transforming impact upon him and galvanised him into giving up his old life of violence for a life marked by kindness and love.

The other extraordinary thing is that also within Jesus' inner circle of disciples was Matthew, the tax-collector. Tax-collectors in those days were not only despised as corrupt government officials but they were seen as collaborators with the hated Romans. In other words, Jesus chose to have both a former resistance-fighter and a former collaborator in the same small group of followers. No wonder there were times when the disciples squabbled among themselves! However, even Matthew the tax-collector and Simon the Zealot learnt to love each other as they discovered how much God accepted and loved them despite all their baggage from the past.

In this month when we focus on remembering with both Remembrance Sunday and the *Remember*, *remember* of Guy Fawkes Day, it is good to remember that at the heart of Christian worship is an act of remembrance. In our communion service we eat bread and wine to remember Christ's body broken and his blood shed on the cross because of his great love for all of us. One of Jesus' final instructions to his followers before he died, was to "Do this is in remembrance of me." It was this constant remembering of Jesus, that enabled those who were former enemies to live in love and harmony. Maybe there lies a lesson for today!

I am sure that many reading this would like an update on the latest activities in Westminster, however as I contribute to this newsletter well in advance of its publication I'm afraid I cannot predict with any certainty what the situation will be when you read it: Perhaps we will be in the throes of a general election! I do however regularly update my website, Facebook and Twitter pages so for more up to date news please do follow them.

Locally there have been two major successes in the past few weeks (I write at the beginning of October.) As the population of the local area increases so does demand for essential services. Key among these is the demand for excellent schools. Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) predicts that primary schools across the county will require an extra 25,000 places by 2031.

I was therefore dismayed earlier this year to hear that schools across Oxfordshire were having trouble expanding their facilities, in particular classroom space, to meet the increase in demand. Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) had asked the Department for Education (DfE) for permission to expand their classrooms and they were refused, on the basis that the sacrifice of playing field space at the schools would be too great.

I was asked to intervene by parents and staff of schools in my constituency. I visited one of the schools myself, Marcham Primary and after a successful intervention by MPs across Oxfordshire I was delighted to receive news last week that the applications for expansion across the county have been approved.

A further cause for celebration is that NHS England have confirmed that not only will PET-Scan services at the Churchill be protected and remain in the hands of Oxford University Hospitals (there were fears earlier this year that they may be lost to a private operator) new scanning services will be provided at other Hospitals serving the constituency, including the Great Western in Swindon. Following intervention by Oxfordshire MPs.

Once again these issues go to show what can be achieved if communities, local councils, MPs and Government work together to achieve the best outcomes.

Finally, the Government is rolling out a new rural broadband scheme from which you may benefit; more information can be found at https://gigabitvoucher.culture.gov.uk/


