We held the first LPPS (Local Police Priority Setting) meeting in October; my thanks go those involved in this process. The following priorities were agreed and will be addressed over the next 3 months.

- 1) Sheds and burglary issues in Lady Bay, Abbey and Gamston ward areas.
- 2) ASB (Anti-social behaviour) in Cotgrave precinct.
- 3) ASB in the Edwalton and Trent Bridge wards of West Bridgford.

Reduce the risk of your bike being stolen:

Lock the frame and both wheels to a stand using two good quality locks. Get your bike registered and visibly security marked with BikeRegister.

Check for FREE bike marking events at www.bikeregister.com/events If your bike is stolen, report it to 101 and register it as stolen on BikeRegister.



We have had successful result at court recently Jamie HANCOCK 29 from Whitcliffe Gardens West Bridgford. Local officers assisted with a warrant at his home address around drugs. He has been jailed for 7 years for drugs offences, money laundering and possession of counterfeit currency.

Over recent weeks we have had reports of motorbikes riding on footpaths around Gamston. As a result of our work in this area, we have seized a motorcycle from a 17 year old male; he has also been issued with a community protection warning letter under ASB (Antisocial behaviour) legislation regarding his on-going use of any motorcycles.

Team updates: Rushcliffe South

We have been dealing with ASB (Anti-social behaviour) in and around Cotgrave precinct; this was agreed as one of the priorities in the new Rushcliffe LPPS (Local Police Priority Setting) agreement.

This priority will run for 3 months from October 2019

In recent weeks we have paid more attention to the precinct, when the Cotgrave Beat team officers are not on duty we have brought beat officers and PCOS's from West Bridgford to conduct patrols and engage with local residents and shops.

Officers will be using BWV (Body Worn Video) to gather intelligence where appropriate.

On Monday the 28th of October we held a beat surgery at Cotgrave library which was attended by a local PC and PCSO along with Cllr Richard Butler and Christine JEFFRIES

A number of local residents attended the event with a wide range of queries and questions which were dealt with by either the officers or Cllrs.

We also held another beat surgery at Cropwell Bishop on the 24th of October.

Local officers attended the local priority setting meeting at Bingham on the 24th of October, attendees from local Neighbourhood watch groups (NHW) spoke with local officers about the issues and concerns for their areas. This information will be fed back to the Rushcliffe LPPS group and local attention will also be paid to those concerns.

Significant arrests

During the evening 27th/28th of October Matthew HEGGARTY, 37 years of age from Moor Lane, Bingham was arrested by response officers, he has been charged with vehicle crime offence and put before the courts.
