Lettings: Vote of thanks to Bill for managing the bookings and agreed unanimously

100 club: Working well, to continue as before, last year just over 100 25% less this year.

Running costs: seem static currently.

<u>Drainage:</u> Possible tree roots starting to impinge on the bottom end of the pitch. Jonathan has discussed with Richard Hopkins and several trees should be felled prior to investigation work and repairs. Also an extension of the land drain along eastern boundary should be put in

<u>Sports photos/mementos</u>: Jonathan has just finished photos and now on display along with the bat donated by Dennis Harper

<u>Lettings/Advertising</u>: Agreed to continue promoting the Pavilion for rent through the Egerton Update

<u>Pavilion Maintenance/Projects:</u> electrics professionally tested and certified as OK for next 5 years

Project to secure lower playing field now completed. External and internal decorating rolling programme to be implemented in next year. Showers to be checked, descaled and drains checked over the winter

Cricket club want to do some rabbit control and replace rabbit fencing at their expense.

Sports Club Rents: Cricket, Junior Football and Running Clubs rents to remain the same.

<u>Southern Water:</u> have shelved project for sewage works as other priorities but will happen at some time. The leylandii hedge so large its impossible to cut back without killing the hedge. Discussions with Southern Water to remove most of the hedge and replace.

Future Projects

A need to improve the drainage for the cricket pitch and football pitch. Cricket Pitch work needs to be done end of October. Football in the summer.

Jonathan looking into the Wifi to be linked from village hall computer centre. Craig suggested hardwiring and laying a cable.

<u>Dog fouling:</u> Jonathan to raise in Egerton Update and Next-Door regarding dogs being kept on leads on the playing fields

Cricket Club projects

Honours Board still a work in progress, pictures and mementos are mainly complete and have been received well.

<u>MUGA</u> most likely site is by the Sewage Works. Fete Committee is holding £10,000 discussed Playing Fields Committee to hold this money. If MUGA doesn't progress Fete Committee can then decide on the monies distribution.

The Geoff Wickens Charitable Trust: Jeff Hopkins reported that Geoff Wickens had left his Estate of approx. £1,100,000 to "maintain, improve and provide Recreation and Sports Facilities in Egerton". Could provide £30 to £40K annual income. The Executors are getting advice on how to manage this money and are considering several ideas.

Agreed Nigel Jeff and future Trustees of the Geoff Wickens Charitable Trust to be seconded onto the committee
