When we became members of Salesbury Parish Council, we promised to do more to find out about your experience of living in Salesbury, Copster Green and the outlying hamlets within the parish. We want to hear your opinions about how we are representing you; how we spend the precept that you fund; and what you would like to see in the future.

Our previous online surveys have had low response rates. 2021's response rate was very low with just under 8% of residents (representing approximately 16% of households) responding, although this was still an improvement on 2020's rate. This year, we are returning to paper copies in the hope of improved engagement. You may choose to complete the survey as an individual or as a household; anonymously or openly - the choice is yours!
