Greetings from an all new Parish Council! Following an excellent turn-out for the local council elections on 2nd May, five new councillors were duly elected and within only a few days faced their first parish council meeting on 8th May, followed closely by the Annual Parish Meeting on 15th May.

To introduce your new Parish Council, we are: Jo Baker (Chair), Andy Bryan (Vice-Chair), Sarah Elvy, Bernadette Sachse and Julie Twibell. Geoff Twibell remains in post as Parish Clerk. A special mention must be given to Ben Partridge who also stood for election; the fact that six candidates stepped forwards ensured that an election took place and that Moulsford would continue to be represented by its own Parish Council. As I write, we are working on our to-do-list, taking up where the outgoing PC left off and deciding where we plan to focus our efforts over the next few years. We will be letting you all know about projects and progress in due course, and of course we do invite parishioners to come along to the PC meetings with their own interests and concerns.

The 2018 Parish Council annual report highlighted the considerable number of achievements of the outgoing PC on behalf of the village. Whether villagers are aware of it or not, a great vote of thanks is owed to the outgoing team, who also have generously offered their time to help the new PC members get underway, which is much appreciated! Chairman's Report

The Council

This year was the final year of a four year term for the Parish Council following the elections in May 2015. During this final year the Parish Council had its full complement of five councillors, Richard Hayward (Vice Chair), Deb Wilkins, Carol Bemis (co-opted in May 2015), Ann Stickings and myself and all very ably supported by Geoff Twibell as Parish Clerk. At the end of the term Richard, Deb, Carol and Ann did not stand for re-election and I would like to thank them for their support and service to the village, it has been much appreciated.

This was also my last year on the council. After sixteen years continuous service it is time for others to bring fresh ideas and I wish the new council well. It was great credit to the village that even with all five councillors not standing for re-election six people put their names forward for election to the five available seats. Most villages have trouble finding enough people to stand; Moulsford is fortunate that its community spirit is so strong and healthy.

Meetings

Regular Parish Council meetings have been held in the Pavilion through the past year - ten council meetings and one annual parish meeting. In addition we had one specially convened site meeting of the whole council to review proposed planning development at Moulsford Preparatory school and one Parish Council village walkabout review.

Dates of the council meetings and the agendas have been displayed on the village notice board and meeting dates also listed in Moulsford News. Copies of the meeting minutes have then been available on both the Pavilion and village notice boards. The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held on the 9th May 2018 and at that meeting the election of the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Parish Council was held and notices of acceptance were signed. The Annual Meeting of Electors was held on the 9th May 2018 and the minutes of that meeting were presented for acceptance at the next meeting held on 15th May 2019.

Council Procedures

The Parish Council has continued to operate in accordance with its powers and duties. The Parish Council Standing Orders and Financial Regulations were updated in 2015 so they aligned with the latest legislation and best practice guidance from the National Association of Local Councils (NALC).

In accordance with the requirements of central government the Clerk is required to maintain a register of Councillor Interests. This register was kept current during the year by the Clerk and in accordance with requirements, the register is available to be viewed by the public and is also accessible through a link on the village website. Also in accordance with the requirements of central government the Clerk is also required to maintain a risk register. This register is kept by the Clerk and was reviewed during the year by the Council.

Finance

A detailed report of the village finances is provided in the Treasurers report, and this report summarises some of the key points.

As has been highlighted at the Annual Parish Meetings over the last seven years, with the Pavilion build completion in 2011, we expected – and still expect! - only very minor capital expenditure over the next few years with such a new facility and we set aside modest sums annually to make provision for such works. £70,000 of the Pavilion build funding was raised as a long-term (40 year) fixed rate government loan and this bi-annual repayment cost has been included in our forward budgeting and now constitutes approximately 30% of the precept. We are now eight years into this 40 year loan.

We maintain a small reserve against unexpected expenditure, and with continuing careful management of expenditure, the Parish Council finances continue to be in a healthy state. This reporting year the Parish Council increased the precept from £13,750 p.a. to £14,000 p.a., was in line with inflation and was in expectation of further declining financial support from both the District and County Council.

Pavilion

In 2011 the Parish Council reconstituted a Pavilion Management Committee (PMC) to manage the operation of the Pavilion on its behalf. This committee continues to do a great job in this eighth year of operation with the Pavilion running costs being met solely from the revenue generated from the hiring of this fantastic village facility.

The only income the Parish Council can – and is allowed by HMRC – to receive from the Pavilion Management Committee in respect of the Pavilion is the £1 peppercorn rent. It is great to see that it remains in fantastic condition, and that, as originally planned, the Pavilion has been self-supporting since inception and this is down to careful planning and the ongoing efforts of the PMC to secure bookings and effectively market and manage the facility. The Pavilion remains a functional asset, for the village and wider local community, not for profit and the Parish Council with the PMC will continue to ensure that the needs of the village take priority.

Moulsford News

Moulsford remains fortunate that it has a regular, informative and free village newsletter delivered to every household ten times p.a. Moulsford News has been managed by Bernadette Sachse and I thank her for continuing to ensure that we have a quality and informative village newsletter that is important to the village. The advertisements are managed by Emma Reynolds and the modest revenue generated (~£800p.a.) is set aside by Parish Council as contingency for future pavilion works. The Parish Council has continued to provide a monthly update article on Parish Council activities in Moulsford News so that readers are up to date with what the Parish Council has been doing on behalf of Moulsford.

Other Activities

In this reporting period a number of village projects and activities have been completed. The main one has been the Pavilion driveway project and the full benefit of having an illuminated driveway to walk up (and down!) will most likely be seen in the later darker evenings. The high kerbing now in place is there to dissuade parking along the driveway and on the grass. The bollards with inbuilt lights are much more robust than the fence posts so we will not be replacing these every few months.

Another key project completed is the update of the village website. After a thorough RFI process a new website provider was selected and with the Parish Council ensuring minimal cost to the village. The new website, www.moulsford-pc.org.uk, is local government legislation compliant, able to accommodate documents and being easier to update, should make it a much more useful resource for the village. With the new website it is already

possible to access and download documents that range from Parish Council minutes through to current and past editions of Moulsford News.

Smaller scale projects and activities completed during the reporting period include: ensuring the commitment made last year from OCC Highways for the 30mph speed markings to be refreshed/repainted was delivered, repair and refurbishment of benches at the bus stops and on the recreation ground, repair and repainting of the two bus shelters in the village, creating additional signage for use near the pavilion and along the driveway, confirming potholes reported via fixmystreet.com had been filled, arranging village litter pick in September 2018 - with hot dogs and hot drinks for all pickers! - arranging CPR/Defibrillator two refresher training sessions in November 2018 run by South Central Ambulance Service (SCAS), justifying to OCC and then funding a grit bin (complete with grit!) in place at the top of Ferry Lane. For the recreation ground, procuring and fitting new goal nets, new basketball net, repainting goalposts, planning the annual external safety inspection of playground equipment as well as monitoring SODC activity associated with planned Packaged Treatment Plant installation, reviewing anti-dog fouling measures, arranging recreation ground grass cutting under the third year of the business arrangement we have with Moulsford Prep – saving the village ~ £1,000 p.a. and producing a better result than in the past!

Acknowledgements

It should be apparent – and is to many outside the village – that Moulsford is fortunate that its community spirit continues to be strong and healthy and for the benefit of the village. We all need this to continue and for everyone to have the opportunity to get involved whether by participation in events, or getting directly involved with the Events Committee, the PMC or indeed the Parish Council.

From the Vicar Andrew Petit

My Dear Friends,

Sunday, the 9th June this year is what is sometimes referred to as "the birthday of the church". We are not talking just about Moulsford Church, but the worldwide Church, the community of those who follow Jesus Christ, whatever their denomination might be.

It all started one Sunday morning in a very crowded Jerusalem, 7 weeks after the very first Easter, nearly two thousand years ago. The city was again packed with Jewish worshippers, who had come from all over the Roman Empire to celebrate a great festival known as *Pentecost*, which commemorated the giving of the 10 commandments to the children of Israel.

Jesus' disciples had been staying in Jerusalem, waiting for something to happen, because that is what Jesus had told them to do. They had been through an emotional roller-coaster with the utter despair following the death of Jesus, and then the elation and joy of seeing him again, discovering that he had overcome death itself and meeting him in different places over a period of six weeks. Finally, there had been the bitter-sweet experience of saying good-bye as Jesus ascended into heaven, knowing that they would not see him in the flesh again, but with the promise that he would somehow be with them in a new way. No doubt they had a sense of anti-climax and anxiety about what the future would hold.

Then on the day of Pentecost, ten days after Jesus had gone from their sight, while the disciples were waiting and praying in their meeting place in an upper room, the most extraordinary thing had happened. There was the sound of a violent wind, like a hurricane, outside, although the weather was still calm. Then a dazzling light or flame appeared in their midst – it seemed to divide up and envelope each one of them. But instead of being burnt, they felt cleansed, inside and out, of any doubts or guilt about failures in the past and they were each filled with a glorious joy and confidence, and a certain knowledge that Jesus was not only with them but somehow *in* them.

That was when they started laughing and singing and shouting – in fact they felt they had to tell the world what was happening. They rushed outside – or perhaps onto the roof - and made such a commotion that they soon attracted a large crowd. They had been too frightened before to confess that they were followers of Jesus of Nazareth or tell anyone that he had in fact risen from the dead, because they feared being arrested and crucified like Jesus. Now, they simply could not keep quiet about it. When the religious authorities threatened to have them thrown into prison and probably executed if they did not keep quiet, Peter replied "We are not able to stop speaking about the things we have seen and heard!".

On that first day of Pentecost, Peter and the others spoke with such power and conviction about knowing that Jesus had risen from the dead and what this meant, that 3,000 people committed themselves to following Christ. They were publicly baptised there and then. And so, the Church was born. Nearly two thousand years have passed since then and the Church has spread across the world and is found today in a whole multitude of languages, forms and cultures. Often sections of it have taken terrible wrong turnings and lost sight of who we are and how we are called to live. But wherever the Church has stayed in close touch with its origins - and has simply lived as those who have discovered the love and forgiveness of God in Jesus Christ and who are called to proclaim and demonstrate that love - there the church continues to thrive and grow and bring blessing to the communities in which it lives.

If you would like to find out a bit more about the Church's birthday, why not come to church on Sunday 9th June at 9.30am when we celebrate *Pentecost*.

Westminster Update

The local elections saw the Conservatives lose our majority on both the Vale of White Horse District Council and South Oxfordshire District Council. I was very sad indeed to see so many hard working local councillors lose their seats, and new candidates who had been hoping to serve fail to achieve their goal.

The newly elected councillors will face similar challenges to those they are replacing, and there are no easy answers. I have always worked with politicians of all parties to get the answers we need locally, and will continue to lobby central government for the support that we need.

Many councillors who lost their seats will rightly blame Westminster. While local issues are very important, there is no doubt that voters use them to send a message to government. I will be taking the message of frustration felt on the doorstep of the campaign and at the ballot box back to Westminster: it is wrong that local politicians who have worked tirelessly for their local communities should bear the brunt of a Westminster failure.

I am working with the AEA Technology Pension Campaign is to secure the pension rights of scheme members that may be otherwise lost because AEA Technology entered a pre-pack administration. If you are a member of the AEA Technology pension scheme, please do contact my office for more info.

In Parliament this month I was delighted to see Fitzwaryn School from the constituency at PMQs and have the opportunity to meet staff and pupils afterwards. Fitzwaryn School is an Outstanding school for SEN pupils in Oxfordshire and I asked Theresa May to support more high needs funding in rural areas.

In the constituency this month I was delighted to welcome HRH The Duke of York to the constituency to open Wave Optics New HQ at Milton Park, Oxfordshire.

On other constituency visits I met GWR Managing Director Mark Hopwood at Didcot Station, 6th Formers from Didcot with an interest in Politics, I attended a meeting of Didcot First at the New Marriott Courtyard hotel in Milton, I was interviewed by a local 6th form student as part of her International Baccalaureate project, and met with local residents and senior management of FirstPort at Alfredston Place in Wantage to discuss issues there.



From your old Parish Council!! - New Village Website



One of the "old" Parish Council projects that completed just before the local elections in May 2019 was the village website refresh. The home page of this new website is illustrated and the triangles by some of the titles indicate that there are additional pages available to view. The new website, www.moulsford-pc.org.uk, is both local government legislation (DCLG Transparency Code for smaller authorities) and Web Content Accessibility Guidelines compliant. We have changed the web address as since the original village website was established 15 or so years ago, the "-pc.org.uk" suffix has become the recommended domain suffix for Parish Councils; in part because of its proximity to the .gov.uk suffix but without the substantial cost of a .gov.uk domain! As a result of the thorough evaluation exercise that was undertaken, the new website has cost the village nothing to set up (typically £250+) and with no ongoing annual maintenance charges (typically £200+ p.a) either.

With the new website it is already possible to access and download documents that range from Parish Council and MEC minutes through to current and past editions of Moulsford News. It also incorporates a Planning Tracker that "hooks" directly to Moulsford related planning applications being dealt with by SODC. The website can also be set for multi-user access so that different village organisations can edit and update specific areas of the website meaning that there is not a single bottleneck to updates that may be required. The overall benefit of this modern website is that as well as being straightforward to update, it should become a much more useful resource for the village. Control of the website has now been passed to the Parish Clerk.

Cholsey WI – Forging Friendships

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

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
