Moulsford News: Dec 2021 / Jan 2022

At the November meeting we co-opted Sue Powell to Moulsford Parish Council which means we are now at capacity. Sue, having lived in Moulsford for around 25 years, currently is secretary of MEC, a regular contributor to the debate around the recent use of the wharf at MPC meetings and is often seen walking her dog in Moulsford, so she is well-known to many of us. We are very pleased to have her join the parish council.

The parish council has continued to pursue effective solutions to traffic and parking issues in Moulsford. We expect to see the introduction of a single white line in Ferry Lane (as described in last month's Moulsford News) very soon, hopefully in time to ease the Xmas parking in the vicinity. We are interested to understand how helpful this measure is particularly for the residents and regular users of the area. Do please provide us feedback by email or by attending the MPC meetings to tell us your experience in person (scheduled MPC meeting dates at the back of this newsletter).

At this point it should be noted that MPC normally do not schedule a council meeting in January, however this can be reviewed and should there be an obvious requirement then a meeting will be arranged and communicated to the village.

Throughout the pandemic/lockdown/restriction period, with people working differently and changes being made to the normal way of doing things, the usual means of communicating with the village were occasionally not adequate or not possible. A good example is the parish council meetings, normally held in-person in the pavilion. For social distance reasons, following government guidance, these had to be moved to meetings over video-conferencing. The upside to this was the attendance. We were very pleased to see attendance increase with villagers requesting logins to join us. Moulsford was very much in step with what was going on around us as society generally became much more accepting of new (digital) ways of doing things.

With our freshly acquired willingness to use digital, MPC are keen to make the parish council website (www.moulsford-pc.org) the go-to place for answers and up-to-date information on Moulsford village. That doesn't mean dropping our normal channels – Village Noticeboard, Moulsford News, Moulsford Village Facebook – which will carry on as normal. It means giving villagers a constant place to go for everything from links to services like Fixmystreet and refuse collection, local interest like North Wessex Downs AONB, SODC and OCC, to current information such as events in Moulsford, planning applications and decisions, urgent notices such as playground equipment out of action. We will be getting onto this shortly and would be pleased to hear from you if you have recent, relevant experience and would like to share your top tips! Please email the clerk:

Tree news!

At last our new trees have arrived, delivered in a remarkably small box by a postie who was highly surprised to learn he was dropping off an entire small woodland of some 100 little trees! With the delayed delivery, we have obviously had to reschedule the planting and with the onset of Christmas preparations and celebrations, plus the increasingly unreliability of the winter weather, we are now aiming to hold the planting in the New Year. We anticipate this will be in February, while the trees are still dormant but with spring on the way.

The new trees are now heeled into winter quarters to await their big moment in a couple of months, but work at the Rec has already got underway in anticipation of their arrival. A few hardy village souls have been out during November starting to prepare the Rec woodland edges by stripping down ivy, clearing back deadwood, removing old tree guards and starting to spread chippings under trees and lay down the foundations of dead hedges and woodpiles. Thanks for your time and efforts everyone!






