Bit of a departure from my usual style of article this month but there is something significant going on across the West Downland Benefice this month and I wanted to share something of our vision!

Supporting Our Village Churches: A Community Legacy Worth Preserving

Our parish churches stand at the heart of our communities. The ancient stones bear witness to generations of village life. Whether you attend Sunday services or simply appreciate its presence as you pass by, the church remains one of our most cherished community assets. This October, the West Downland Benefice is launching a stewardship campaign, and we're asking everyone to consider how they might help ensure this precious heritage remains for future generations.

The Reality of Church Funding

Many people assume the Church of England is wealthy, perhaps imagining vast coffers filled from centuries past. The reality is quite different. Our parish churches receive no funding from the government, and contrary to popular belief, they don't receive significant

money from the Church Commissioners or central church funds. Instead, each parish church relies almost entirely on the generosity of its local community to survive.

Every year, our churches face substantial running costs: heating and lighting bills, insurance, maintenance of the building and churchyard, and contributing to the ministry costs that provide pastoral care throughout our benefice. These expenses continue regardless of how many people attend services, and they're rising year on year along with everything else.

More Than Just a Building

While not everyone in our villages worship regularly, most recognise the church's vital role in community life. It's where many were married, where children are christened, and where we gather to say



farewell to loved ones. The church provides a peaceful space for reflection, hosts community events, and offers pastoral support during difficult times. It's a constant in our changing world, connecting us to our history while serving present needs.

The building itself is also a significant part of our village's character and heritage. Property values often reflect the desirability of living near a well-maintained church, and many visitors come specifically to see our historic building.

Your Church Needs You

This October, we're inviting everyone who values having a church in our community to consider joining the Parish Giving Scheme. Whether you give £5, £50 or £500 a month, every contribution makes a real difference. Regular giving helps us plan ahead with confidence, knowing we can meet our ongoing commitments and reach the needs of the communities we serve..

If you pay tax, Gift Aid increases your donation by 25% at no extra cost to you. A £20 monthly donation becomes £25, and a £40 donation becomes £50 through this government scheme.

assets continue to serve our villages for generations to come.
