SHAPE Update

Jubilee Field: as many of you will have seen, Jubilee Field has now been transformed from a grassy field to an exciting new play area. Although the contractors have now finished on site, the turfed and seeded areas need some time to establish before the play area can open for use – not long now! Please can all parents ensure that their children stay off the site until the security fencing has been removed and the field is open – thank you.

The Leys: work on the play area for younger children, is due to start very soon – we hope that the work will be completed before the start of the summer holidays.

Maintenance Rota - your help needed! Have you signed up for the SHAPE maintenance rota? Thank you if you have - we will be in touch with details soon. If you haven't yet volunteered, this is what is involved...The play areas are owned by the village and it's our community's responsibility to look after them. Having spent all this time and money getting them up and running, we want to keep them looking good for a long time! Hence the need for volunteers with a sense of community spirit. Anyone can help (though you need to be over 16). We need you to sign up for a week's slot (or more) a year. When it's your week, you will need to visit both Jubilee Field and The Levs at least twice to pick up litter, check for general tidiness and good order, undertake a basic inspection of the equipment (for which instructions will be given), and note and report any damage or problems. Why is the council making savings?

On-going cuts in central government funding mean Oxfordshire County Council has to make savings. The council is currently in the process of making approximately £290 million of savings. Those savings began in 2010 and run until 2018. On top of those savings, the council currently believes it may need to save a further £60 million.

Supported transport savings

As part of the council's budget setting process in February 2015, councillors reduced the overall supported transport budget by a fifth (£6.3 million). As far as possible, we are trying to make these savings in supported transport by running services more efficiently. We have identified that we can achieve nearly £3.7 million in savings by bringing together all the supported transport services we operate and fund. However, this is not enough. The council needs to find a minimum of £2.6 million in additional savings and this means looking at supported transport services which the council is not required to provide by law. This will inevitably impact some people in the county.

Free Pension Advise from CAB:

Citizens' Advice West Oxfordshire, which is the delivery centre for the national Pension Wise service for individuals in Oxfordshire, Reading and Milton Keynes, are offering face-to-face Pension Wise appointments in a variety of locations across the region.

A Pension Wise appointment is intended to provide free guidance to individuals who are approaching retirement or are 55 or over, have a defined contribution pension, and are thinking of accessing their pension in the next six months.

The pension reforms that came in this April give people the freedom to access their defined contribution pension how and when they want. You can buy an annuity, or take your pension out in one go, or withdraw it bit by bit and leave some it invested. Planning for your retirement can be complicated so it's important to get guidance on your options.

The good news is that the Government has introduced Pension Wise, a new free service offering guidance online, over the phone with The Pensions Advisory Service, or face to face with Citizens Advice. The appointments are pre-booked 45 minute sessions tailored to your individual circumstances. Guidance is impartial, meaning that it will not recommend products or services, but they will describe your options and help you consider their impact.

Big Summer Sing in Eynsham

On 19th July 2015, local folk singer Cat Kelly hopes to bring together around 100 people for a Sunday afternoon of singing in Eynsham Village Hall. This is the second year that Cat has held a summer singing event for members of the choirs she conducts all year round, but this year has decided to open it up to ANYONE who wants to come and join in! If you love a good sing but don't have time for a regular choir, this may be just the thing for you - a relaxed afternoon of singing, followed by an opportunity to perform what you've learnt, and a tasty buffet supper thrown in for good measure. The Big Summer Sing will comprise an open-access workshop in the afternoon, with songs that are suitable for all ages and abilities. You'll learn to sing a variety of songs of different styles; from folk and world music to something a bit more contemporary, building from simple rounds into glorious harmonies! It doesn't matter if you aren't a confident singer, as there will be parts suitable for everyone, and there's absolutely no need to read music, as all the songs will be taught by ear.

After the workshop there will be a buffet supper, to which you can invite friends and family - the singers will perform all the songs they've learnt that afternoon, and there will be a joint performance by Rising Voices and Chipping Norton Singers, who between them amass some 80 voices.


