St Michael's Church Restoration Fund

On Saturday 20 April, William and Susan Gascoigne kindly opened Stanton Harcourt Manor to visitors to raise funds for St Michael's Church. The kitchen and chapel were open as well as the gardens, which allowed this photo of the Church and Pope's Tower, reflected in one of the old fish-ponds. Cream teas were served in the Church afterwards. Thank you to everybody who has so generously donated to the Church Restoration Fund in response both to this opportunity and to the recent appeal, and huge thanks to the Gascoignes for opening the Manor. To reiterate, all the funds raised go to the Church.

The Restoration Fund Committee is in the process of appointing contractors to complete those repairs to the Church which are most pressing. However, we are still some way off the amount required to complete all the work highlighted by the inspection report, and a reserve of funds is needed to cover ongoing maintenance and emergency repairs.

The Church is a beautiful and historically significant building at the heart of our Village. It is, of course, a place for worship and used by many in the community for weddings, baptisms and other rites of passage, but the Church is also an important focus for many other aspects of Village life including school activities, concerts, children's workshops, flower festivals, and exhibitions.

The care of the Church as a building and the costs involved in its upkeep are the responsibility of the parish. **Please consider making a donation.** You will be making an enduring contribution to an important part of the life of this Village.
