

From the Vicar

I hope that you are well, and enjoying the summer? Cuddesdon seems rather quiet at the moment, whenever I visit, with a large cohort of ordinands and their families having left the College in June. I look forward to the arrival of new ordinands, partners, spouses, children, and new staff too, over the next few weeks; and I'm sure that the village will, as always, make them feel welcome.

On Sunday 24th September, we have our annual Harvest Festival and 'College Welcome' service, in All Saints' Church. Although All Saints' Church exists to serve all the residents of Cuddesdon, Denton and Chippinghurst, and you are all welcome to any and all services, we are particularly keen to invite everyone to the Harvest Festival. Parish Council

The application to register the Bat and Ball as an asset of community value has been submitted to the District Council. They have raised a few points and so some additional work is being done to complete the application process.

Ripon College has been approached by an organisation working on a government pilot scheme to create a drone highway between Reading and Coventry. The organisation identified Cuddesdon as a suitable location for a mast which would be used to monitor and control drones in the corridor, and they asked if they could put a mast up at the bottom corner of the College's football field. The mast would be about 25m high.

After consideration, the College has decided they do not want to have the mast in their field, and the Parish Council agrees with their decision.

The Parish Council considered having safety mirrors installed at the two sharp bends near the Dove House development when the road was modified a while ago. This was so that drivers could see cars coming towards them round the corners. There has been a further request for these mirrors but we are not going to have them because the County Council is opposed to it. They consider that mirrors can be misleading in terms of drivers misjudging vehicle speeds and distances. Also, there is no recent history of accidents in this area.

The Parish Council has supported the planning application for a garage at 1 Dove House Lane (P23/S1892/HH). This is a revision to a previous application at the location.

There is a new application for a house at Upper Farm in Denton (P23/S2093/S73). This replaces a previous application because the site now has a new owner and they want to change the design. The Parish Council is opposed to this application because they think the building is too close to the road, too large and not traditional as was the previous design. They also consider that their objections to the previous application still apply. These include that it is overdevelopment of the site, it encroaches onto the green belt, and the lane is unsuited to any increase in traffic.

(NB The deadline to apply will have passed when you read this, so hopefully we can tell you who we have next time). And after that, we have much work to do – save the Pub, tidy up the village, make sure the Dove House development is finished off in a good way and many other things besides.

We'll do our very best and do please contact me, the clerk or any of your councillors if we can help with anything or you have any issues.

Our Church Organ

For the last forty years we at All Saints' have been fortunate to possess a two manual, tracker action pipe organ by one of the greatest Victorian English organ builders, Henry Willis (1821-1901), known as "Father" Willis because his son & grandson followed him in the business. When only 26, he rebuilt Gloucester Cathedral organ & never looked back. Many of our cathedrals have his instruments, including Canterbury, Durham, Exeter, Hereford, Winchester & St. Paul's. His organs were noted for their sound construction & beautifully "voiced" pipes, qualities equally to be found in the modest-sized organs he built for parish churches all over the country.





Our organ was built for St. Margaret's Convent, East Grinstead designed by G. E. Street, the architect of Cuddesdon College, & installed in the west gallery of their chapel in 1883, after his death. When the Convent closed in 1972 the instrument was removed by Bishops of Beethoven Street, London, who have continued to maintain it to this day, & transferred to Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford while its Rieger organ was being erected. There it was played by the cathedral organist, Simon Preston, later to be organist of Westminster Abbey.

When they had finished with it, we managed to acquire it after a lot of fund raising & voluntary hospitality to the builders in 1982. Thus much was already known, but recently I have been following the back story of the original donor to the East Grinstead Convent.

Julia Elizabeth Chaffyn Grove was the last of a family who had lived for centuries at Zeals House, a rambling mansion near Mere in Wiltshire. A single lady, she inherited in 1865 on her brother's death. He had built the village church of St. Martin's, designed by Gilbert Scott, advisory architect to Salisbury Cathedral. She set to embellishing the church, buying a set of bells, adding a spire to the existing tower, & creating a stone, carved reredos. She also paid for an organ in memory of her brother, built by a local Bath organist, William Sweetland. A devout Anglican & appreciative of the role music plays in worship, she offered to buy Salisbury Cathedral the grand Father Willis organ still in use today. From correspondence during 1876/77 it is clear she was closely involved with the clergy, architect & organ builder over its installation.. In 1878 Scott ceased to be cathedral architect & the post was taken up by Street, who at that time was designing the East Grinstead Chapel. The Convent's archives held in Pusey House, Oxford, credit Miss Chaffyn Groves (sic) with the purchase of the Willis organ for the chapel, but why the generous benefactress in the diocese of Salisbury should have done so for a convent in Sussex is a matter of conjecture. Did she know one of nuns? Many were well-connected & may have approached her? Or is the connection Street himself, who may have told her of the chapel he was designing so she offered to provide an organ, turning to Father Willis with whom she had had dealings over the cathedral instrument? Shall we ever know? What is clear is that "our" organ was originally paid for by Julia Chaffyn Grove, & in a round-about way, if she hadn't bought Salisbury its cathedral organ, ours might never have been built.



Julia Chaffyn Grove died in 1891 & is buried near the south porch of St Martin's Church, Zeals where there is a monument like a medieval cross: a similar one was erected by her friends outside neighbouring St Michael the Archangel's, Mere, in 1904. The local school, community building & alms houses all bear the family name. We too have become beneficiaries, by remove.

John Howell MP writes... August 2023

I know that many constituents share my concern on issues around climate change. As such I understand some of the concerns expressed over the decision to agree new oil and gas licences. However it is important that this is seen in context alongside other measures that are being introduced.

The wider context is that of energy security. We have all witnessed how Russia has manipulated and weaponised energy, disrupting supply and stalling growth in countries around the world. Now we need to increase our energy security to reduce our dependence on imports. This will help to protect our economy, the carbon footprint of domestic gas production being around 1/4 the footprint of imported liquified natural gas.

Alongside the oil and gas licences the Government has also confirmed two more industrial Carbon Capture, Usage and Storage locations helping all parts of the United Kingdom to reach net zero by 2050. This puts us on track to store 20-30 million tonnes of CO₂ per annum by 2030, which is the equivalent to removing approximately 4-6 million cars from UK roads each year. It will also help realise the UK's carbon storage potential, which, with an estimated 78 billion tonnes of theoretical CO₂ storage capacity on the continental shelf is some of the largest in the world.

At the same time as this announcement from our own Government I was interested to read the comments of Dr Jim Skea, the head of the IPCC, about achieving target of limiting global warming. Dr Skea recognises that if you constantly communicate a very negative message it can paralyze people and prevents them from taking the necessary steps to get a grip on climate change. Whilst he in no way underestimates the problem his pragmatic approach is refreshing. He hopes to adapt the IPCC to provide better and targeted advice to specific groups such as town planners, landowners and businesses recognising the need to address "real people and their real lives". The Prime Minister has stated that the Government is keen to reach the target in a way that is proportionate, pragmatic and does not place unnecessary burdens to household budgets. OXFAMS SECOND HAND CLOTHES CAMPAIGN

UK consumers bought 32% more second-hand clothes in 2022 than in 2018, If each adult in the UK donated all the clothes that they have not worn in the past year to charity shops, it could remove 4.9 billion kg carbon from entering the atmosphere. That is equivalent to a plane flying around the world more than 6,600 times, or 100,000 flights from London (Heathrow) to Greece (Athens).
