Support offered	Training (content & style) for talks and tours If you give talks or tours to Care Home residents or other vulnerable people you will receive Dementia Friends and Adult Safeguarding training and may require a DBS check Out-of-pocket expenses are refundable, including mileage to Ladbroke and to offsite talks
What you could get out of it	Being part of an enthusiastic and friendly team Sharing a beautiful building, interesting history and some great stories with other people The satisfaction of helping our project and opening people's eyes to our heritage
Other relevant information	You may need to be on your feet for a long time and lift large objects like display boards Off-site speakers will need computer own transport (unless working with a second volunteer who can provide this) Where this role requires you to work with vulnerable adults groups, we operate a Safer Recruitment policy and volunteers will be required to undergo appropriate level DBS checks
