

THE COFFEE CARAVAN COMES TO TOWN

The Coffee Caravan is an idea pioneered in Suffolk to counter "rural isolation" and is based on the premise that nobody should be disadvantaged just because they live in a rural, rather than urban, area. The initiative has proved extremely successful in the fifteen years that it has been running in Suffolk (see this link for a video: www.ruralcoffeecaravan.org.uk).

DEFIBRILLATOR

Hodsoll Street and Ridley Village Hall Association has recently carried out a fund-raising exercise in order to purchase and maintain a defibrillator for the local community. At present the nearest defibrillator is in New Ash Green. Thanks to the generosity of several local charities and to the success of a very entertaining Valentine's Day Quiz the defibrillator has now been purchased and is ready for installation in the redundant phone box next to the Village Hall.

Modern defibrillators are highly automated and will talk users through the defibrillation process. However, it is intended to organise two first aid and defibrillator training sessions for local residents.
