HISTORY ON YOUR DOORSTEP

Laxton holds a unique place in the agricultural and social history of England, & it is right here on our doorsteps. It is the last example of a working open field farming system where individual farmers work their strips in three large open fields. The system is managed by the Court Leet, which is the only such manorial court in the land with the power to determine its own legal proceedings and levy fines. Each year there are a series of walks round the village and the fields, looking at different aspects of life in Laxton today; how it has been shaped by it's history and how it has adapted to current requirements to conserve wildlife and nature. The walks are lead by Stuart Rose, a Laxton Farmer and member of the Jury and Court Leet. All walks leave from the Visitor Centre in the Dovecote Inn car park and are free of charge. Walkers are recommended to bring a packed lunch and to come with stout

footwear and clothing appropriate to the weather. The first walk takes place on 15th March, beginning at 10am. Please call **07939 228353** if you are interested in coming along.

WARTIME PLANE CRASH IN HALAM

In the early hours of the night of 10th April 1943, Avro Lancaster ED823 was on a night training flight from RAF Winthorpe. The plane collided with high-tension cables and then crashed into the fields just beyond Halam village. Sadly the entire crew of seven men was killed. The crash site was just off School Lane, between the lane and Goldhill, and it said that you can still tell where the plane crashed by a slight depression in the ground. Round this spot the

ground is bare and crops grow only very sparsely, whereas the rest of the field produces normal crops.



MAY CLARKE, DIED 16TH FEBRUARY 2009, AGED 102 YEARS

May was born in Halam and spent most of her years, post childhood, living and working in the village. She worked with her Aunt and Uncle on the farm at "Littledale Cottage", then she moved with her widowed Aunt to The Cottages on the Turnpike in 1940. During & after World War 2, May worked at Caudwells Flour Mill in Southwell, cycling there, or walking in bad weather! Until 1966 she looked after her Aunt - a difficult and demanding task!

May was a regular member of the congregation at Halam Chapel and loyally supported their events. She was well known in the area for her beautiful knitting and cooking, winning many prizes at local shows. She took great pride in her garden, particularly her tomatoes and sweet scented flowers

After a fall six years ago, May went to Ashlands, but will always be remembered for her caring friendship and generosity and for being a wonderful neighbour to so many.

Strategic Housing Land Allocation Assessment (SHLAA) Andrew Paris reported on an assessment prepared by District Council which identifies sites in Halam as "may be suitable" for the building of 202 new homes. He read out a response he had prepared expressing the Parish Council's surprise and concerns regarding the proposals. With the addition of a comment regarding development of the school playing field, it was unanimously agreed to send the letter to the District Council. It appears that the "sustainability" of development in the village has been based on the District Council's misconception that the village shop and post office is still open.

Japanese Knotweed Japanese knotweed is a rapid growing invasive weed introduced to Europe as an ornamental plant in the early 19th century. Once established, this large vigorous weed can colonise most habitats and is regarded as a troublesome pest in many parts of the country because of its rapid invasion and domination of habitats, which results in the exclusion of other plants. It can damage property (for example by growing through tarmac, concrete or even the floors of houses. The species also causes problems in terms of flood management. It increases the risk of riverbank erosion and can also create a flooding hazard if the dead stems are washed into the streams and clog up the channel. A fragment of root as small as 0.8 grams can grow to form a new plant. **Unfortunately Japanese Knotweed seems to have spread to Halam!** While there is no statutory requirement for landowners to remove the plant from their property, because of its potential harm to native species, it is listed on Schedule 9 and subject to section 14 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, which makes it an offence to plant, or cause this species to grow, in the wild. In addition, Japanese knotweed is regarded as controlled waste and has to be disposed of at licensed sites or by burning on site. For more information see www.defra.gov.uk and search for knotweed – it can be treated with glyphosate ("RoundUp"), but will need to be treated twice a year for three years running
